After School Clubs - January 2026



The way we do after school clubs is changing.

We are asking parents to register their child for all clubs via MCAS each half term for the next half term's clubs. Clubs will run from w/c 12th January to w/c 2nd February.

As previously communicated ([link to letter](#)), there is now a charge of £10 per half term (4 sessions) for each club, payable in advance via MCAS. Places are limited and will be allocated on a first come first served basis.

Next half term's clubs are now available to book. Just go onto MCAS and choose 'Before and after school clubs', and any clubs available for your child to book onto will be displayed.

Payment is required at the time of booking.

Please note that if you sign your child up, the £10 is non-refundable, even if your child does not attend one of the sessions. If we cancel any of the sessions for any reason, we will try to reschedule, but if this is not possible a refund will be given for that session.

A Christmas Message from Santa

Santa's Christmas Digital Rules. Follow these simple rules to protect your child's brain!



1. Keep bedrooms device-free.
Santa loves everything... including tired children who didn't sleep well because a screen kept them awake. Bedrooms should be calm, cosy places to rest and grow, not places where brains stay switched on.

2. Stop screens at least an hour before bedtimes.
Children's brains do their most important growing while they sleep. Evening screen time makes it harder for them to switch off. Santa says: protect their sleep like a treasure; it matters far more than any notification.

3. Talk to your child about what they're doing online.
When children know they can come to you with worries or questions, their brains learn to process new information safely. Show interest. Ask gentle questions. Be the grown-up helper they turn to first.

4. No devices at mealtimes.
Family meals are a gift, a chance to laugh, share stories and notice how children are really doing. Keeping phones and tablets away helps everyone reconnect.

5. Use parental controls and apps.
Santa always says it clearly: these tools help keep children safe. Set age-appropriate restrictions and cap daily app use so the online world doesn't swallow their free time.

6. Let children be bored - it's good for their brains.
Boredom isn't a problem; it's a gift. When children aren't entertained by a screen, their brains switch to imagination, problem-solving and creativity. Give them space to daydream, invent games, build worlds and occupy themselves. These moments help them grow in ways no app ever could.

Here are a few things that you, as a parent, could do today to protect your child's brain.




Thinking of giving your child a phone for Christmas?



The smartphone is **NOT** a perfect gift! What are the risks? Why Waiting Matters!



As Christmas gets closer, many children are dreaming of their first smartphone. It's a big deal. It shows they're becoming more independent and trustworthy. But before you get one wrapped up, it's important to think about what a smartphone really means for your child, especially children who are still figuring out how to handle friendships, feelings and the online world.

The latest research reveals that children aged 8-14 spend almost 3 hours online each day, mostly on smartphones. Even the youngest are telling researchers that they often see upsetting or confusing things online, and more and more are being exposed to adult content before they're ready. Social media platforms, many of which have age limits of 13 and above, keep young people scrolling back through peer pressure, clever algorithms and features that keep them scrolling.

We all want our children to be safe, confident and happy. But giving them a smartphone too early puts them in situations they can't handle on their own: messages from strangers, friendship problems that spill into every hour of the day and content that changes how they see themselves and the world. Once a child has a smartphone, it becomes much harder to protect them from the risks of an unmonitored digital life.

There is a plenty of time for independence as they grow. Childhood is short. Holding off, even for just one more year, gives your child the gift of time: time to grow, time to learn good habits, time to play, read, rest and be present in their real world.

This Christmas, the most loving answer might be the hardest one: *not yet*. Your child might not thank you today, but their future self will.

If you give your child a smartphone, please ensure you set up parental controls and add restrictions to what they can do.



A smartphone and social media may **NOT** be the best Christmas present! Make sure you understand the risks as well as the benefits.

Year 4 Swimming Lessons

*Year 4 children will be going swimming at Arnold Leisure Centre (we will walk there with staff from school). The morning swimming sessions start on **Wednesday 7th January** and will be weekly through to Wednesday 22nd July. Your child will need to come to school in their normal school uniform on swimming days. Please can you ensure your child brings their swimming costume and towel in a separate bag. The Local Education Authority issue rules regarding swimming costumes which are as follows:*

Girls – one piece swimming costume

Boys – swimming trunks or close-fitting shorts without side pockets and no longer than mid-thigh length, please see Mrs Greentree if you are unsure.

Hair which is longer than jaw length should be tied back or in a cap.

All jewellery must be removed.

Earrings cannot be taped over or covered by a hat.

Goggles can be worn. However, it is the responsibility of the parent/carer to adjust and fit the goggles correctly and to write a letter of consent to the class teacher.

Please adhere to the regulations, as the instructors will not let your child swim if they break the rules.

Please note that there will be no tuck (Year 4 only) on a swimming day so if you have pre-ordered don't forget to pop on to MCAS to cancel it as you may still be charged. Thank you.



Year 4 Residential Visit to Lea Green Outdoor Activity Centre (Places still available- book via MCAS)

We are holding a parents' information meeting for parents of children attending the Lea Green residential on Thursday 5th February at 3.40pm. It would be great to see as many of you there as possible.

The purpose of the meeting is to inform parents of the plans for the visit and to answer any questions or concerns you may have. We will also give out an information booklet, consent and medical forms which will need to be returned by 14th February.

If you haven't done so already it is not too late to book a place for your child.

Due to last year's residential being such a resounding success, in March 2026 (Tuesday 24th – Wednesday 25th), we have arranged to take Year 4 children on a residential visit to Lea Green Outdoor Activity Centre in Derbyshire. Going on a residential to Lea Green is a fantastic experience for children as it has so many activities to offer and the staff who run it are brilliant at making sure the children have the best time possible.

The children will have a full two-day learning experience with one night staying over at Lea Green. The grounds at Lea Green are extensive and staying in such a grand house, which was built in 1761, is an experience in itself.

The activities the children will take part in are:

- *Orienteering*
- *Low ropes obstacle course*
- *Bushcraft*
- *Go-karting*
- *Problem solving team challenges*
- *Co-operative games.*

There will also be lots of opportunities for children to have free time and use the different facilities at the center to enable them to wind down at the end of a busy day. The facilities include a games room (table football, pool tables, various games etc.), a sports hall, play ground and of course a shop.

The children will also take part in an ambush type game where the staff are the catchers – my favourite activity.

The cost of the trip is £141 and includes includes transport to and from school to Lea Green, meals, bedding, use of all the facilities and activities led by the staff at the center.

We hope that as many of Year 4 as possible can come (45 places have been booked as last year we took every member of Year 4).

We have set up a payment plan as follows:

**£50 non-refundable deposit Friday 31st October*

** £30 non-refundable instalment Friday 28th November*

**£30 non-refundable instalment Friday 30th January*

**£31 non-refundable final payment Friday 27th February*

Please note that all payments must be paid by the due dates at the very latest. When you pay the £50 deposit, you secure the place and are making a commitment for your child to attend, and you are agreeing to pay the remaining balances by their due dates. If your child decides they no longer want to attend, a refund will not be issued and any remaining balance will still need to be paid, unless a replacement can be found.

The parents' information meeting is after school on Thursday 5th February, this will cover kit list and medical requirements etc. In the meantime, if you have any questions, you can contact me by phoning school or emailing me on office@arnoldmill.notts.sch.uk.
