Payment is required at the time of booking, and this is your confirmation that a place has been allocated – you will not receive a separate notification.

Please note that if you sign your child up, the £10 is non-refundable, even if your child changes their mind or misses a session. If we cancel any of the sessions for any reason, we will try to reschedule, but if this is not possible a refund will be given for that session.

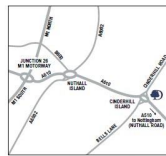

Safety first:

Not only is storing and recycling batteries safely great for the environment, it can also help reduce risks associated with batteries:

- *Batteries can cause serious injury or death if swallowed, please keep batteries out of reach of small children and pets.*

- Lithium and button batteries need to be taped so their contacts don't touch, as they could short circuit if they do.

Use sticky tape over the contacts (top and bottom of batteries). Button batteries can be placed in a line between two sections of sticky tape. Lithium batteries can look like any battery, but they will have lithium (Li) written on them.

Batteries we CAN accept:

We are collecting common household batteries:

- AAA, AA, C, D, 9V and button batteries

Any batteries marked with the word lithium (Li) should have their contacts (e.g. top and tail) taped over.

Batteries we CANNOT accept:

- Damaged or leaking batteries
- Very dirty batteries
- Car Batteries
- Industrial Batteries
- Batteries with connecting wires (unless taped to the side of the battery)

Although we're not asking for them, we will collect things like: mobile phone and similar device specific batteries, as well as laptop and power tool batteries, if they are put in your collection box.

Sun Protection Guidelines – Sun Hats and Sun Cream



Now that the warm weather has arrived I would like to remind parents/carers of our sun protection guidance.

On hot days we will encourage children to wear a hat, drink plenty of water and sit in the shade as required.

-
- *Please make sure your child brings a sun hat/cap and water bottle (marked with their name and class) to school*
 - *Please ensure that your child is wearing suitable school shoes (no trainers, flip flops, crocs or open toed shoes)*
 - ***Please apply sun cream to your child before they come to school on hot days. The long lasting protection types are recommended.** If your child is prone to burning and you feel they may need an additional application you may send in a bottle of sun cream (marked with their name), which your child should give to their teacher. Your child will be able to apply the cream themselves when needed (usually just before lunchtime) under the supervision of a classroom staff member.*

If your child requires a staff member to assist with applying additional sun cream please email the class teacher to confirm that you give consent for a member of staff to assist your child to apply an additional application of the sun cream you have/will provide.
