Dear Parents and Carers,

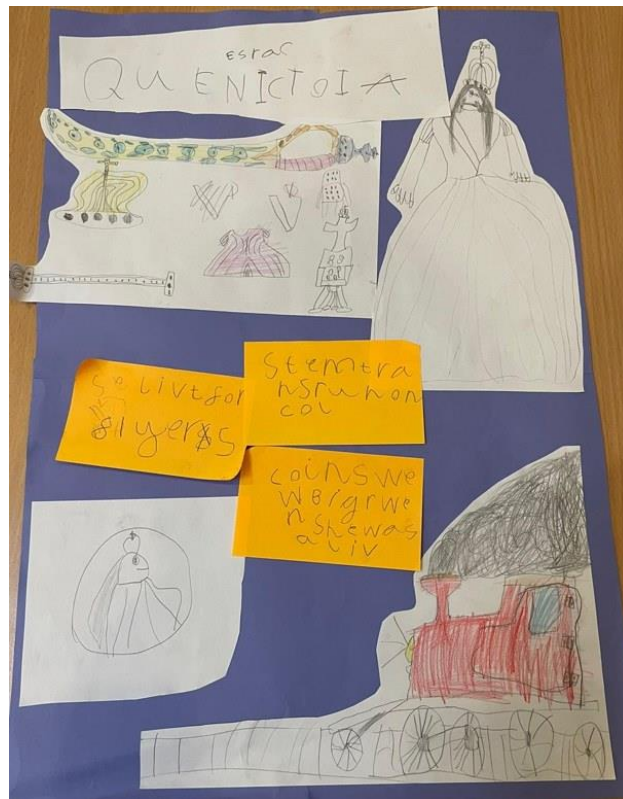

Nottingham Girls' High School have offered the school thirty places at the matinee performance of 'Fuel Protest' on Wednesday 7th February (children will be escorted by members of staff to and from the event). The children will be required to wear school uniform.

***Lunch arrangements** – The show is 11.30 am – 12.30 pm so children will need to be provided with a packed lunch and a drink which they will have when they return to school.*

If you would like to order a school packed lunch the cost is £2.95 and should be paid using your child's ParentPay account (select pay for a school meal - unless your child is entitled to free school meals). Orders for a school packed lunch must be received by 31st January 2024 (please tick the relevant box on the hard copy Permission Form).

Year 5 & 6 visit to The National Justice Museum – Thursday 21st March 2024

*In support of our topic for the summer term on 'Crime & Punishment', we have arranged a visit to the **National Justice Museum in Nottingham**. This visit is always a favourite and provides the children with the opportunity to visit a Victorian gaol (jail), courtroom and more modern police station and cells. This year, the children will have the opportunity to be Victorian CSI agents as well as learning about the history of the gaol and of Nottingham itself!*

***The cost of the visit is £12.74 per child (payable via your child's ParentPay account by 14th March please)** and this includes return coach transport and entry to the museum, including three one-hour, guided activities. The visit will take place within our normal school day leaving at 9.15am and returning before 3.30pm. The children will need to wear school uniform.*

The children will need to be provided with a drink (not fizzy or glass bottles please) and a packed lunch for the trip (please confirm whether you will send a home prepared or ordering one from school) one can be ordered from school – please select the relevant option on the Trip Permission Form). Please complete the Trip Permission Form, which was sent home this week, and return it to the school office by 7th March 2024.

Child Height and Weight Measurements: Children in Reception (F2) and Year 6



Height and weight checks for children in Reception and Year 6

Every year in England, school children in Reception and Year 6 have their height and weight checked at school as part of the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP). These measurements are used to check they're in the healthy weight range. Your child's class will take part in this year's programme starting in September 2023.

What happens in the child measurement programme?

The checks are carried out by members of the Healthy Family's Team. Children are measured fully clothed, except for their coats and shoes, in a private space away from other pupils. The programme will be delivered in a safe way in line with safety control measures for schools and healthcare.

The wellbeing of children and families is very important. Measurements are conducted sensitively, and your child's results will not be shared with teachers or other children. It is your choice if you share the information with your child.

How do I find out my child's results?

You will not be notified of your child's measurement if your child is in the healthy weight category. If your child is underweight or above healthy weight, you will receive a letter with your child's results. The weight and height information are shared only with you.

This letter will include your child's measurements together with information about healthy eating, being active and related activities available in your area.

Why do we need to take the measurements?

We collect this information because it is in the public interest to understand how many children overweight, healthy weight are or underweight. By comparing your child's weight with their age, height, and sex, we can tell whether they're growing as expected. Your child's ethnicity and address are used to help understand some of the reasons for differences in child weight across England.

We can use your child's NHS number to link their measurements in Reception and Year 6. We can also use other data to understand how and why a child's weight may be changing, how this affects their health and education and how we can improve the care they receive.

This data includes:

- their birth, hospital care (including time in hospital and out-patient appointments and diagnosis of medical conditions)

- o mental health
- o social care
- o primary care - includes all healthcare outside of hospital such as GP and dental appointments,
- o public health - including data relating to preventing ill health such as immunisation records.
- o records for when and the reason why people pass away
- o medical conditions such as cancer, diabetes
- o health, lifestyle and wellbeing surveys that your child has participated in

All the data collected is also used for improving health, care and services through research and planning. The information is treated confidentially and held securely.

Withdrawing your child from the National Child Measurement Programme

The emotional impact of the NCMP has been researched and studies show that body image, self-esteem, weight-related teasing, and restrictive eating behaviours do not change as a result of being measured or receiving feedback.

If you do not want your child to take part, or your child has a medical condition that affects their height or weight, please write in confidence to the school marking the envelope – for the attention of the Healthy Families Team and NCMP within 10 days of receiving this letter. You will need to include your child's name, date of birth, class, school and reasons for opting out. Children will not be made to take part on the day if they do not want to.

If you are happy for your child to be measured, you do not need to do anything.

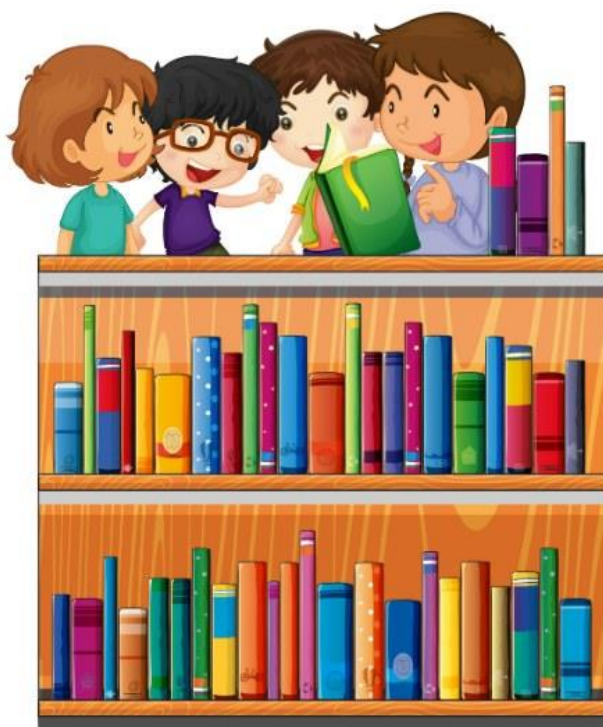
Spring Parents' Evening

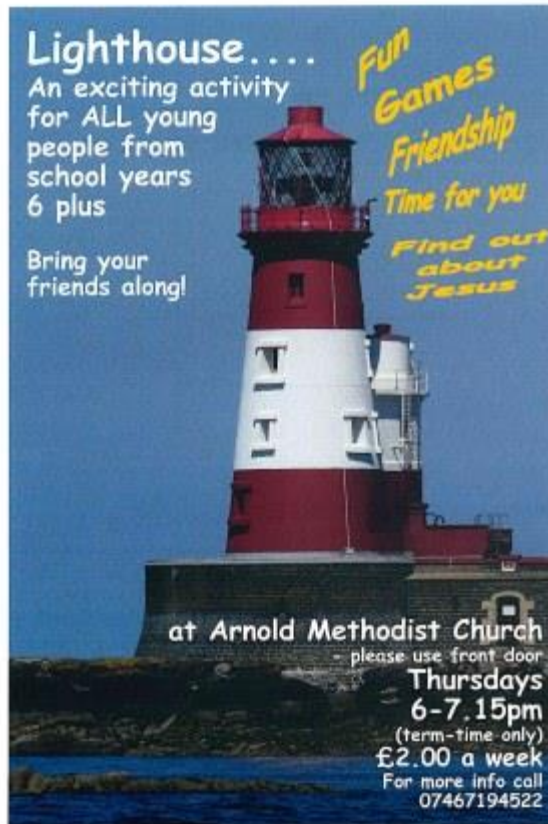

What are the health impacts

Air pollution from idling cars can lead to:

- Increased chance of developing lung cancer
- Increased risk of heart disease
- Increase in asthma, coughs and bronchitis

Children

Children are the most at risk because they:

- Have smaller lungs and breathe more rapidly
- Spend more time outdoors
- Tend to be more active and breathe more deeply

How it affects you and others

Excessive idling is a waste of fuel and money, resulting in an unnecessary negative environmental impact.

People inside cars are exposed to high levels of air pollution, with children especially at risk of harmful effects.

Nottinghamshire's air pollution contributes to hundreds of premature deaths each year.

Don't sit there idle

Keeping the engine running while stuck in traffic or waiting to collect someone pollutes the air we breathe.

It's up to all of us

Drivers in Gedling Borough can make some simple changes to improve air quality in the Borough.

Most pollution comes from vehicles and idling produces unnecessary air pollution and wastes fuel.

Schools, hospitals and bus stops in particular are hot spots, as:

- Idling is more likely to happen in these locations
- They have sensitive age groups, such as children and older people.



Switch off when waiting or stuck in a jam.

Switch to cycling or walking for local trips.

Switch to a bus or train when you can for longer journeys

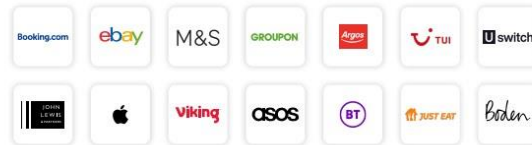

Inspiring Reading

Children need support to develop the habit and love of reading. How can you be their inspiration?

1. Talk about the reader's interests and inclinations - find connected texts that tempt to explore and discuss together.
2. Think about why reading is good for them - focus on intrinsic motivation rather than external rewards.
3. Capitalise on opportunities to share reading thoughts and interests with others - encourage them to notice preference and choice.
4. Find regular opportunities to visit your local/ school library.
5. Make reading time relaxed and interactive - chat about pictures, characters, likes, dislikes and interesting facts.
6. Be a reading detective by investigating the different purposes for reading (e.g. adverts to persuade, news to inform, stories to entertain).
7. Recognise and celebrate diversity in texts - empower reading of magazines, comics and texts that reflect different realities.
8. Invite others into the reading space - share the love of reading together in your reading community!
