Our rocks star maths day was well supported and the children all looked amazing. The key stage 2 children are all working hard to beat Arnold View in our times tables battle.


With a trophy up for grabs, we definitely want to win!

We've had lots of visitors to school this week offering the children focused PSHE lessons. We've had lots of comments about how well behaved our children are - which is always great to hear.


I'm looking forward to whatever next week brings.



#### **Message from Nottinghamshire County Council:**

Major financial pressures including rising food, staff and energy costs will mean the cost of a school meal, supplied by the County Council to schools across the county, will go up by 40p.

The price charged by the council to schools for a meal will increase from £2.55 to £2.95 and will take effect from 16 October 2023.



# Inspiring Reading



Children need support to develop the habit and love of reading. How can you be their inspiration?

- 1. Talk about the reader's interests and inclinations find connected texts that tempt to explore and discuss together.
- Think about why reading is good for them focus on intrinsic motivation rather than external rewards.
  - Capitalise on opportunities to share reading thoughts and interests with others encourage them to notice preference and choice.
  - 4. Find regular opportunities to visit your local/ school library.
  - Make reading time relaxed and interactive chat about pictures, characters, likes, dislikes and interesting facts.
  - 6. Be a reading detective by investigating the different purposes for reading (e.g. adverts to persuade, news to inform, stories to entertain).

    7. Recognise and celebrate diversity in texts - empower reading of

  - magazines, comics and texts that reflect different realities.

    8. Invite others into the reading space share the love of reading together in your reading community!
