Our skin can burn even if its cloudy! Apply sunscreen to protect your skin. Wear sunglasses.




Keep your eyes protected with sunglasses that are designed to block UV rays.

NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme



I am pleased to inform you that we are participating in the NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe.

Programme this term. Speak out. Stay safe. is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed, alongside NSPCC volunteer led face to face workshops for children in years 2, 5 and 6. The content is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot Buddy.

Parents and carers are asked to let school know if their child may have experienced anything (in the past or happening now) which may mean they need extra support before, during or after taking part in this programme.

#### Year 3 and 4 Ancient Egyptian Day - Tuesday 9th July 2024



In support of our curriculum topic for the summer term, 'A Trip Down the Nile', rather than taking the children on a more costly coach trip to a museum or attraction, we have arranged for a company called 'The Specialists' to come in to school to run a series of fun workshops for the children on Tuesday 9th July 2024 (during normal school hours). Children are not expected to dress up for the event.

Learning outside the classroom or in a workshop format is a valuable and effective means of extending pupil knowledge, enriching pupil understanding and promoting personal and social development. We encourage educational visits/or experiences for all our pupils and hope that parents will recognise the value and importance of these visits or events and give their full support.

The whole school cost of the day is £372.00 and includes a full day of activities. This represents excellent value for money as we won't have to pay for transport (which would be at least £450 on its own). The company provide all the resources needed for the children to learn about the Ancient Egyptians. The school is asking for a contribution of just £4.13 per child which should be paid via your child's ParentPay account please.

**Contributions for Trips and Activities:** 

We believe in the value of these experiences and try to ensure that these opportunities are accessible and affordable to all. However, the school does not have the financial resources to pay the full cost of every trip/activity. Your child will not be excluded if you are unable to contribute. However, please note that without such contributions, trips and activities may have to be cancelled, due to a lack of funds. Please also bear in mind that the school staff run non-curriculum After School Clubs at the end of the school day, something which we could charge for but, to date, have not. We aim to give the children the best possible chances in their education whilst trying to balance the cost for both ourselves and parents. I hope that you will support us in this and that this paragraph has clarified contributions for trips and activities.

Foundation 2 visit to White Post Farm: 10th July 2024



In support of our learning in 'Understanding the world around us' the children in F2a and F2b will be visiting White Post Farm (during normal school hours) on the above date. The trip includes a guided tour of the farm, garden and barn, animal feed and the return coach trip. There is no cost for this trip as the full cost of the trip (coach and entrance fee) is kindly being funded by a local business, Fineline Market Research. Your child will, however, need a drink (no fizzy drinks please). If you get chance, please pop on to your child's SimsParent account (available via App and website) to check that our records in respect of any special dietary needs are correct. If you don't yet have a SimsParent login please email the office to request you sign up details. Your child will need and small rucksack to put their lunch in and they will need to carry their own rucksack on the day. The children should be in school uniform unless the weather is wet and then a pair of waterproof trousers and wellies or walking boots should be sent. As we are going in July, we hope for good weather so children should bring a hat and have sunscreen applied before school. As we will be outside, please send them with an extra layer, in just in case it feels chilly in the shade. Please pick your child up at normal time from their classroom, we will be returning to school during the early afternoon, depending on traffic, so should be back in plenty of time. If your child needs to take any


- The trip will be at no cost to you due to the fundraising efforts of Mrs Hussain's (henna tattoos and samosa sales).

#### **Key Stage 2 Music Lesson Tasters**



Key Stage 2 children have the opportunity to take music lessons with one of our external music teachers.

At the moment, I would just like to get an idea of interest and numbers of next years Key Stage 2 pupils, who would like to take lessons (we can offer a taster session prior to final sign up).

#### **Key information**

- Lessons will be ongoing throughout the school year.
- Lessons will take place during the school day (your child will miss part of a regular lesson, break or lunchtime).
  - Fees will be paid directly to the external music provider (in advance), not to the school.
    - Pupils may only sign up for one music lesson during school time.
  - Children that signed up for guitar, drums and piano this academic year will be able to continue if they wish.
- Please note that places are limited so we cannot guarantee your child will be successful should they apply for lessons

Flute/Clarinet lessons slots are offered to children that will be in class 2a, 2b, 2c, 2d and 2e. The day is yet to be agreed as it is subject to room availability and the number of children signing up.

Lessons will be priced per term as follows:

Shared lesson: £73.42 per pupil

Individual 20-minute lesson: £146.84 per pupil

Individual 30-minute lesson: £220.26 per pupil

#### **Instrument Loan Scheme**

£16 per instrument per term within an Inspire Music teaching contract

£20 per instrument, plus VAT (£24), per quarter (3-months) outside an Inspire

Music teaching contract. The option is called Direct Hire.

Piano lesson slots are fully booked, should spaces become available we will advise parents.

If your child is interested in signing up for a music please complete and submit the expression of interest form (<u>link here</u>) and we will pass your details to the relevant music provider.

Don't forget, if your child already learns an instrument at school (guitar, piano, drum) please **do not** sign your child up for another instrument if they are planning to continue with those lessons.

Year 6 Leavers' Hoodies for next year

We are looking at ordering leavers' hoodies for the current year 5 pupils so that they are available to wear from September onwards.

Could you please complete <u>this form</u> as soon as possible to show how you would like your child's name to appear on the rear of the hoodie to enable to the suppliers to create the design. We will send out a proof of the design before it is finalised.

If you would like to order a hoodie, please go onto ParentPay and make a payment **by Friday 19th July 2024** so that the order can be made over the summer holidays ready for September. The prices are:

- £18.00 for children's sizes 9-11 (32") or 12-13 (34")
  - £21.00 for adult sizes XS, S, M, L

You may pay by instalment if you wish, just pay a minimum of £5 by **Friday 19th July** to secure your order. We will then require the final balance to be settled before the goods are handed over in September.

We will have some example sizes in school from w/c, so if you're unsure of what size to buy, pop into the office to have a look. We would suggest going slightly bigger to allow for growth throughout the year.

#### **School Payments**



Dear Parent/Carer

Just a polite reminder that School dinners, tuck, Arnie's Breakfast Club and Millie's After School Club should be paid in advance via your child's ParentPay Account.

TUCK - should be paid in advance. Please note that from now on children will not be able to order tuck unless their account is in credit (ie, topped up with sufficient funds to pay for the item of tuck item they wish to order.

**SCHOOL DINNER** - should be paid in advance or on the day.

ARNIE'S BREAKFAST CLUB – should be paid for in advance or on the day (if you pay via childcare vouchers we understand that there can be a delay in the funding coming through once you have completed the necessary paperwork and notified the school office)

MILLIE'S AFTER SCHOOL CLUB - should be booked and paid for in advance or on the day (if you pay via childcare vouchers we understand that there can be a delay in the funding coming through once you have completed the necessary paperwork)

I wanted to say a big thank you as the majority of our parents are supportive of our no debt stance and pay their bills promptly/in advance. This approach means we can effectively spend our budget on the children's education rather than paying for unnecessary debts incurred (the school has to pay for every meal/breakfast prepared by the kitchen, for staffing/oncosts for breakfast club and after school club along with admin time spent chasing payments).

It also means that we continue to have a positive working relationships our families; of course in extreme circumstances where a debt remains unpaid the school reserves the right to escalate to a debt collection service (and/or where the debt relates to school meals a parent/carer may be required to provide a packed lunch until the debt is cleared).

Free school meals (FSM) are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the qualifying benefits below:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earning from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).
  - Income Support
  - Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
  - Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
  - Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
    - The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- <u>Child Tax Credit</u> (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual gross income of no more than £16,190

 Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after the person stops qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

We want to make sure as many eligible pupils as possible are claiming their free school meals. For more information please visit <a href="https://www.nottinghamshire.qov.uk/education/school-meals/free-school-meals-and-milk">https://www.nottinghamshire.qov.uk/education/school-meals/free-school-meals-and-milk</a> or telephone Nottinghamshire County Council on 0300 500 80 80 (you will need your personal details parent/carer national insurance number and date of birth along with the child's details in full, including their date of birth and the school they attend).

All pupils in reception, year 1, and year 2 are entitled to Universal infant free school meals (UIFSM), this is different to FSM so if you met the above criteria to claim for Free School Meals we would be grateful if you still apply for the funding as (a) it helps the school access additional funding streams (b) you will not automatically receive Free School Meals when your child moves to Year 3.

#### Sun Protection Guidelines - Sun Hats and Sun Cream

Now that the warm weather has arrived I would like to remind parents/carers of our sun protection guidance.

On hot days we will encourage children to wear a hat, drink plenty of water and sit in the shade as required.

- Please make sure your child brings a sun hat/cap and water bottle (marked with their name and class) to school
- Please ensure that your child is wearing suitable school shoes (no trainers, flip flops or open toed shoes)
- Please apply sun cream to your child before they come to school on hot days. The long lasting protection types are recommended. If your child is prone to burning and you feel they may need an additional application you may send in a bottle of sun cream (marked with their name), which your child should give to their teacher. Your child will be able to apply the cream themselves when needed (usually just before lunchtime) under the supervision of a classroom staff member.

If your child requires a staff member to assist with applying additional sun cream please email the class teacher to confirm that you give consent for a member of staff to assist your child to apply an additional application of the sun cream you have/will provide.
