Key Stage 2 - Outdoor Winter Carol Concert - All welcome - Tickets not needed



Monday 19th December 2.30-3.15pm

We would like to invite parents/carers to join us for this performance. Due to the number of children/adults attending the performance it will be held on the playground (weather permitting) and therefore tickets are not needed – just turn up. Please note that seats won't be provided for this performance. If you have mobility issues and require a seat, please let us know. If we have inclement weather on the day, we will rearrange for performance for Tuesday 20th or Wednesday 21st December. Keep an eye on your emails or our website and Facebook page for updates.

We would like to clarify the arrangements for the day as follows:

- The pedestrian gate on Cross Street will be opened approximately ten minutes before the performance start time.
- Please note that the pedestrian gate on Bestwood Avenue will remained locked until 3.15pm so the only access will be via the main entrance on Cross Street.
- The main vehicular access gates leading to the staff car park generally remains closed during the day, if the gate happens to be open please do not park in the car park as you risk being locked in (the gates will remain locked between 3.00 & 3.50pm).
 - Drinks and biscuits will be available after the performance and children can then be collected from their classes at 3.30pm as usual.

REMINDER - in line with our Safeguarding Policy and Social Media Parental Agreement, there should be no phones out during the performance. Don't worry - we will pop some photos onto your child's

Key Stage 1 (Class 1a, 1b, 1c) Christmas Party





Children's Work






School Clubs - Applications now closed

We have also extended the French club to include Year 4 children and this can be applied for by clicking this <u>link</u>. We would ask that if your child has already been allocated onto a club on a Tuesday, that you don't apply for this club. Again, we will let parents know whether a place has been allocated on this club on Wednesday 21st December.

We would emphasise that if you have signed your child up to a club, they should attend every week unless there are exceptional circumstances. If your child can't make it for any reason, you should let the office know. If, for any reason, the school needs to cancel a club, e.g. staff absence, we will email and text the relevant parents.

Year 3/4 visit to Southwell Minster on Tuesday 28th February 2023

In support of our History topic on 'The Romans' we have arranged a visit to Southwell Minster. Southwell stands on the site of a Roman Villa - one of the largest in the country. Southwell Community Archaeology Group will be supporting us with our day and will be providing three hands-on sessions. These sessions will include archaeology, living history and a site walk.

The cost of the visit is £13.50 (payable on <u>ParentPay</u>) and includes the coach transport and the guided activities. The visit will take place within our normal school day (the coach will be leaving at 9.30am and returning at approximately 3.00pm). The children will need to wear school uniform and have a warm/waterproof coat, gloves, and hat please.

LUNCH ARRANGEMENTS - The children will need a packed lunch, including a drink (not fizzy or glass bottles please). This can either be home prepared or you can order a school packed lunch for £2.40 (payable on ParentPay [Dinner money account] unless your child is entitled to free school meals).

We will send home hard copy trip permission forms, medical information forms and confirmation of packed lunch arrangements (including how to order a school prepared lunch) for completion nearer the time.


