#### Sun Protection Guidelines – Sun Hats, Sun Cream & sensible footwear



Now that the warm weather has arrived I would like to remind parents/carers of our sun protection quidance.

On hot days we will encourage children to wear a hat, drink plenty of water and sit in the shade as required.

- Please make sure your child brings a sun hat/cap and water bottle (marked with their name and class) to school
- Please ensure that your child is wearing suitable school shoes (no trainers, flip flops or open toed shoes)
- Please apply sun cream to your child before they come to school on hot days. The long lasting protection types are recommended. If your child is prone to burning and you feel they may need an additional application you may send in a bottle of sun cream (marked with their name), which your child should give to their teacher. Your child will be able to apply the cream themselves when needed (usually just before lunchtime) under the supervision of a classroom staff member.

If your child requires a staff member to assist with applying additional sun cream please email the class teacher to confirm that you give consent for a member of staff to assist your child to apply an additional application of the sun cream you have/will provide.



F2 Trip to Sherwood Pines: Tuesday 20th June



We have arranged to take the children from F2 on a visit to Sherwood Pines on Tuesday 20th June 2023. We will be making woodland art, learning about minibeasts and pond dipping. The trip will take place during normal school hours.

The cost of the visit is £12.20 per child payable via ParentPay by 5th June 2023 (we recognise that finances may be stretched, so we have tried to give you as much notice as possible, we have also

tried to be flexible by way of offering the option to pay the full amount either in small increments to suit, or in one lump sum). The cost includes the organised activities at Sherwood Pines, hiring a bus and a free packed- lunch (as your child is entitled to Universal Free School Meals).

We will send hard copy trip permission forms and medical information forms for completion nearer the time.

On the day, children will be expected to wear school uniform but can wear trainers or similar comfy shoes, they will also need a drink and a morning snack. If it is very hot they will need a sun hat and have sunscreen applied.

Year 6 Trip to see Now Hear This: Friday 23rd June



We are offering year 6 pupils the opportunity to attend 'Now Hear this!' at the Royal Concert Hall on Friday 23rd June.

The event takes place during the day at from 1.00-2:30pm. Pupils will travel to and from the event via public transport accompanied by school staff. If your child would like to attend, please make payment via ParentPay. The cost of the trip will be £5.70, which includes a ticket for the event and travel. This is a completely optional trip and children who don't go will remain in class.

Now Hear This is a fun-packed, fast-paced introduction to classical music and the instruments of the orchestra for Key Stage 2 children aged 7-11, with the chance to join the world famous Hallé orchestra in making a sensational sound.

This year's theme is Out of This World, full of the music of sci-fi and fantasy. The concert begins with the epic Sunrise from Strauss' Also Sprach Zarathustra, best known from Stanley Kubrick's 2001: A Space Odyssey. Your guide to the concert is presenter, dancer and bassoonist, Ruth Rosales. She takes us on a journey into some fantastic worlds, escaping the trolls with Grieg's Peer Gynt In the Hall of the Mountain King, flying with the Angry Birds and battling alongside the heroes of Final Fantasy. There are fantastic creatures too, with Tchaikovsky's Swan Lake and the lullaby from Stravinsky's Firebird. After some dancing skeletons from Saint-Saens' Danse Macabre, the concert ends, with the famous Duel of the Fates from Star Wars.

Year 6 Sports Festival at Redhill: Wednesday 28th June



All Year 6 pupils will be attending the Sports Festival at Redhill on the afternoon of Wednesday 28th June 2023. The event will be during school time and the pupils will be back in school by 3.30pm for normal collection. Please make sure your child has their P.E kit in school on the day of the event.

There will be a number of different activities being led by Sports Leaders and each group will experience four of those on a rotation, approximately 25 minutes at each. Each group will also have a Sports Leader assigned to them who will stay with that group for the whole afternoon, encourage them and move them from one activity to another.

If the weather is poor on the day, we will cancel and try to rearrange the event. Most activities are outside so if the weather is nice, please provide sun cream, a water bottle and a hat.

Year 1 Trip to Stonebridge City Farm: Monday 3rd July



Dear Parents and Carers,

#### Year 1 visit to Stonebridge City Farm – Monday 3rd July 2023

In support of our curriculum topics for the summer term, 'Growing and Animals' Year 1 children will be visiting Stonebridge City Farm (during normal school hours). During the visit, the children will have the opportunity to feed the animals, take part in a farm, barn and garden led by the farm staff and to play in the play area.

The trip includes a guided tour of the farm, garden and barn, animal feed and the return coach trip.

The cost is £4.90 per child (the cost of this trip is reduced due to Mrs Hussain's fundraising efforts)

and should be paid via your child's ParentPay account by 23rd June please.

#### **Useful Information:**

- As Year 1 children are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals, Mrs Burrows will be providing a packed lunch. Your child will, however, need a drink (no fizzy drinks please) and small rucksack to put their lunch in please (they will need to carry their own rucksack on the day).
- There is also a gift shop, if your child wishes to bring a small amount of money with them to spend (no more than £5), this is fine. Spending money should be sent in a named purse/wallet and handed to their teacher in the morning.
- The children must come in their school uniform but can wear trainers or suitable footwear for walking around the City Farm.

- If the weather is hot, please ensure they are wearing sun cream and a sunhat. As we will be outside, please send them with an extra layer, just in case it feels chilly in the shade.
- Please pick your child up at normal time from their classroom, we will be returning to school during the early afternoon, depending on traffic, so should be back in plenty of time.
- If your child needs to take any medication with them on this trip (such as inhalers, hayfever medicine and travel sickness tablets) you will need to fill out a separate form for each medicine and hand the completed form and the medication (in a clear sandwich bag with your child's name on it) in on the day.
- A hard copy of the necessary permission form and medication forms will be sent home for you to complete nearer the time.

If you have any questions about the day, please talk to your child's teacher.

#### F1 (nursery) Picnic at Arnot Park: Thursday 6th July



This year we are hoping to celebrate the end of the academic year and their learning journey achievements at Arnold Mill by organising a picnic for all **F1am and F1pm** children. This will be held at Arnot Park, Arnold during school time on Thursday 6th July.

We hope the picnic will be an enjoyable time for the children and that they will create some lasting memories to take with them.

Please confirm whether, or not, your child will be attending by completing the electronic form <u>link</u> <u>here</u> by midnight on 25th June. If your child is unable to attend the picnic please do not bring them into school that day as all of the F1 staff will be at the park with the children.

#### We would like to clarify the arrangements for the day as follows:

- Both morning and afternoon children need to arrive at their classroom by 9.00am.
- The children (escorted by staff) will walk to the park for a fun filled day of games and activities, and of course to eat their picnic lunch!
- Please ensure that your child has sun cream applied and has a hat, as the sun will probably be strong. They will also need a small rucksack to carry their own picnic and belongings in.
- The children will need a packed lunch. You will be asked to confirm if you are ordering a school packed lunch or you will provide a home prepared packed lunch when you complete the permission form. The closing date for school packed lunch orders is midnight on 25th June.
- The children will all need a drink of water in a named water bottle no fizzy drinks, fruit juices, squash etc. please.
- The children are welcome to bring a **small** teddy for the picnic (please make sure it is named and not a special teddy, just in case it gets lost!!)
  - We aim to be back in school for 3pm so please collect your child from their classroom at 3.25pm.

Year 3 and 4 Ancient Anglo-Saxon Day: Wednesday 12th July 2023



In support of our curriculum topic for the summer term, 'Invade, Raid, Stayed', rather than taking the children on a more costly coach trip to a museum or attraction, we have arranged for the trip to come to us - a company called 'The Specialists' will run a series of fun workshops for the children on Wednesday 12th July.

Learning outside the classroom or in a workshop format is a valuable and effective means of extending pupil knowledge, enriching pupil understanding and promoting personal and social development. We encourage educational visits and experiences for all our pupils and hope that parents will recognise the value and importance of these visits or events and give them their full support.

The whole school cost of the day is £357 and includes a whole day of activities. This represents excellent value for money as we won't have to pay for transport (which would be at least £350). The company provide all the resources needed for the children to learn about the Anglo-Saxons. **The day works out at £4 per child and should be paid via your child's ParentPay account by 8th July 2023.** 

We believe in the value of these experiences and try to ensure that these opportunities are accessible and affordable to all. However, the school does not have the financial resources to pay for every trip or in-school trip alternative. The contribution is voluntary, and your child will not be excluded if you are unable to contribute. However, please note that without all such voluntary contributions, trips and activities may have to be cancelled, due to a lack of funds. We aim to give the children the best possible chances in their education whilst trying to balance the cost for both ourselves and parents. We hope that you will support us in this.



Although your child will have routine hearing tests it is important you look out for any hearing problems.

Signs of possible hearing problems:

- Talking loudly and listening to the tv at a high volume.
   Difficulty pin pointing where a sound is coming from.
- A change in their progress at

   Not responding when their name is called.

Speak to your GP or Health Family Team if you have any concerns. Your child can have a hearing test at any age.



## **National Child Measurement Programme**



To help monitor national trends and to tackle individual lems the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP) sures the height and weight of every child in reception year ged 4 to 5) and Year 6 (aged 10 to 11 years) in all primary schools.

Trained staff from the Nottinghamshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust carry out the measurements.


