Please note that all clubs will be cancelled on Tuesday 4th July due to the Meet the Teacher event.

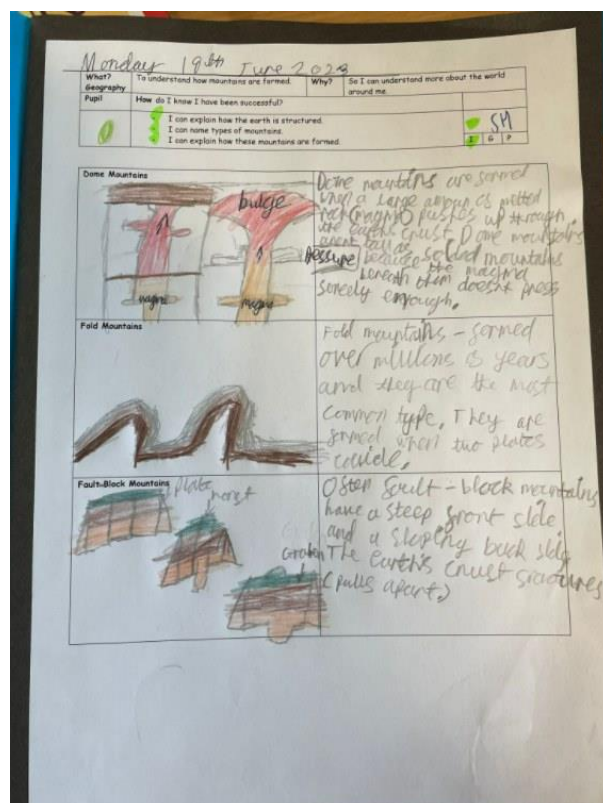
School reports will be sent out by email on **Friday 14th July**.





Dome Mountains




formed from hot molten material (magma) rising from the earth's mantle into the crust that pushes overlying sedimentary rock layers upward to form a "dome" shape.

Fault Block Mountains




formed by the movement of large crustal blocks along faults joined by tensional forces pull apart the crust (figure 3). Tension is often the result of uplifting part of the crust. It can also be produced by opposite-flowing convection cells in the mantle (see figure 1).

Dome Mountains




Dome mountains are formed from magma rising from the earth's mantle into the crust that pushes overlying rock layers upward to form a dome shape. Unlike a volcano, the magma does not reach the Earth's surface.

Fold Mountains




Fold mountains are formed when two or more of Earth's tectonic plates are pushed together. At these colliding, compressing boundaries, rocks and debris are warped and folded into rocky outcrops.

Fault Block Mountains






Fault block mountains are formed by the movement of large crustal blocks when forces in the Earth's crust pull it apart. Some parts of the Earth are pushed upward and others collapse down.

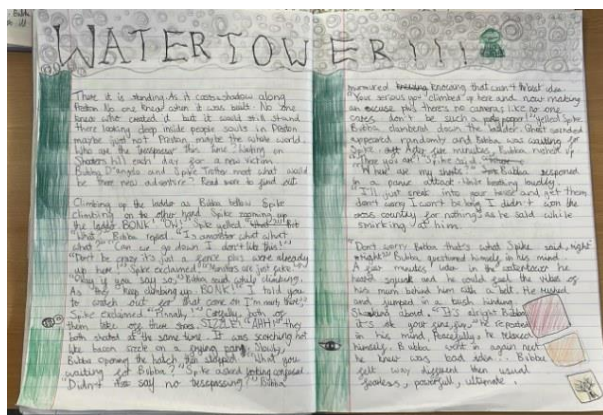
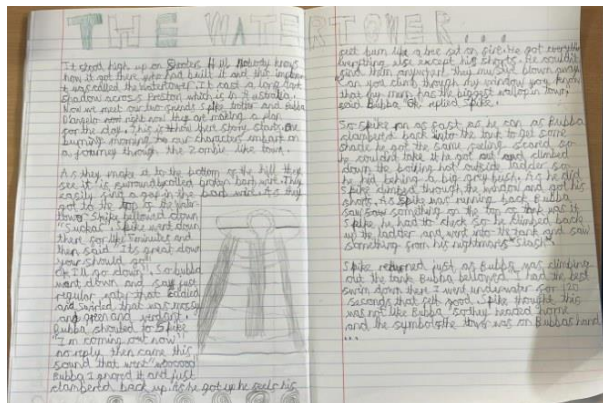
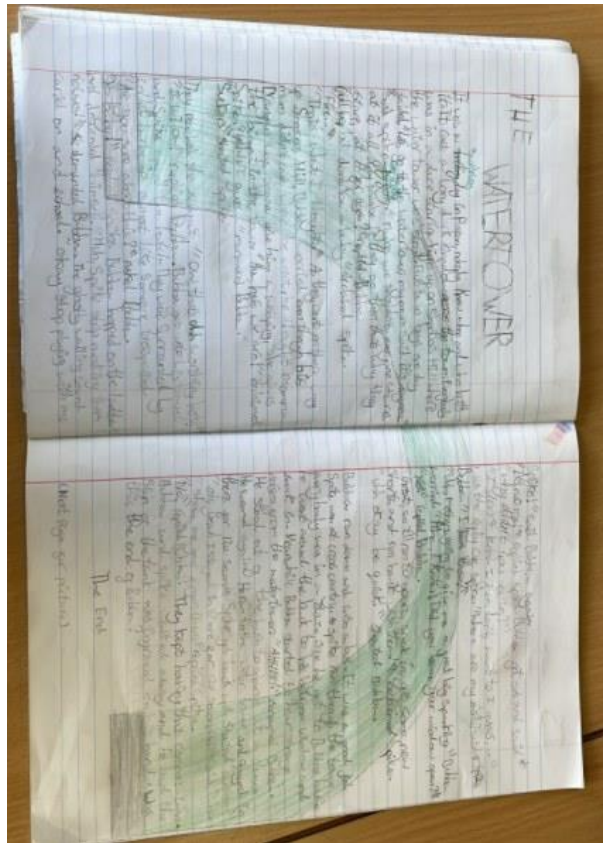
The magma pushes the crust up to make a dome then the magma cools down to harden then the dome mountains are formed.

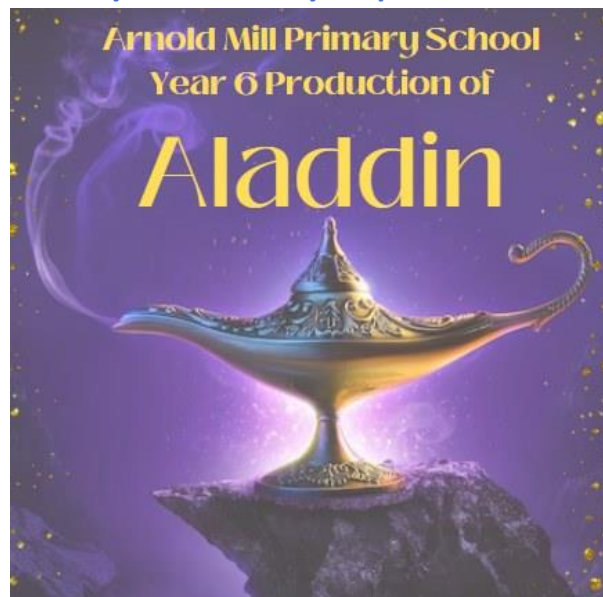

Sun Protection Guidelines – Sun Hats, Sun Cream & sensible footwear



Now that the warm weather has arrived I would like to remind parents/carers of our sun protection guidance.

On hot days we will encourage children to wear a hat, drink plenty of water and sit in the shade as required.

- Please make sure your child brings a sun hat/cap and water bottle (marked with their name and class) to school*
 - Please ensure that your child is wearing suitable school shoes (no trainers, flip flops or open toed shoes)*
 - **Please apply sun cream to your child before they come to school on hot days. The long lasting protection types are recommended.** If your child is prone to burning and you feel they may need an additional application you may send in a bottle of sun cream (marked with their name), which your child should give to their teacher. Your child will be able to apply the cream themselves when needed (usually just before lunchtime) under the supervision of a classroom staff member.*

If your child requires a staff member to assist with applying additional sun cream please email the class teacher to confirm that you give consent for a member of staff to assist your child to apply an additional application of the sun cream you have/will provide.

Other Upcoming School Events:

Year 6 Sports Festival at Redhill: Wednesday 28th June



All Year 6 pupils will be attending the Sports Festival at Redhill on the afternoon of Wednesday 28th June 2023. The event will be during school time and the pupils will be back in school by 3.30pm for normal collection. Please make sure your child has their P.E kit in school on the day of the event.

There will be a number of different activities being led by Sports Leaders and each group will experience four of those on a rotation, approximately 25 minutes at each. Each group will also have

a Sports Leader assigned to them who will stay with that group for the whole afternoon, encourage them and move them from one activity to another.

If the weather is poor on the day, we will cancel and try to rearrange the event. Most activities are outside so if the weather is nice, please provide sun cream, a water bottle and a hat.

Year 1 Trip to Stonebridge City Farm: Monday 3rd July



Dear Parents and Carers,

Year 1 visit to Stonebridge City Farm – Monday 3rd July 2023

*In support of our curriculum topics for the summer term, ‘**Growing and Animals**’ Year 1 children will be visiting Stonebridge City Farm (during normal school hours). During the visit, the children will have the opportunity to feed the animals, take part in a farm, barn and garden led by the farm staff and to play in the play area.*

*The trip includes a guided tour of the farm, garden and barn, animal feed and the return coach trip. **The cost is £4.90 per child** (the cost of this trip is reduced due to Mrs Hussain’s fundraising efforts) and **should be paid via your child’s ParentPay account by 23rd June please.***

Useful Information:

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- ***As Year 1 children are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals, Mrs Burrows will be providing a packed lunch.*** Your child will, however, need a drink (no fizzy drinks please) and small rucksack to put their lunch in please (they will need to carry their own rucksack on the day).
 - *There is also a gift shop, if your child wishes to bring a small amount of money with them to spend (no more than £5), this is fine. Spending money should be sent in a named purse/wallet and handed to their teacher in the morning.*
 - *The children must come in their school uniform but can wear trainers or suitable footwear for walking around the City Farm.*
 - *If the weather is hot, please ensure they are wearing sun cream and a sunhat. As we will be outside, please send them with an extra layer, just in case it feels chilly in the shade.*
 - *Please pick your child up at normal time from their classroom, we will be returning to school during the early afternoon, depending on traffic, so should be back in plenty of time.*
 - *If your child needs to take any medication with them on this trip (such as inhalers, hayfever medicine and travel sickness tablets) you will need to fill out a separate form for each medicine and hand the completed form and the medication (in a clear sandwich bag with your child's name on it) in on the day.*
 - *A hard copy of the necessary permission form and medication forms will be sent home for you to complete nearer the time.*

This year we are hoping to celebrate the end of the academic year and their learning journey achievements at Arnold Mill by organising a picnic for all **F1am and F1pm** children. This will be held at Arnot Park, Arnold during school time on Thursday 6th July.

We hope the picnic will be an enjoyable time for the children and that they will create some lasting memories to take with them.

Please confirm whether, or not, your child will be attending by completing the electronic form [link here](#) by midnight on 25th June. If your child is unable to attend the picnic please do not bring them into school that day as all of the F1 staff will be at the park with the children.

We would like to clarify the arrangements for the day as follows:

- *Both morning and afternoon children need to arrive at their classroom by 9.00am.*
 - *The children (escorted by staff) will walk to the park for a fun filled day of games and activities, and of course to eat their picnic lunch!*
 - *Please ensure that your child has sun cream applied and has a hat, as the sun will probably be strong. They will also need a small rucksack to carry their own picnic and belongings in.*
 - *The children will need a packed lunch. You will be asked to confirm if you are ordering a school packed lunch or you will provide a home prepared packed lunch when you complete the permission form. The closing date for school packed lunch orders is midnight on **25th June**.*

 - *We aim to be back in school for 3pm so please collect your child from their classroom at 3.25pm.*

Year 3 and 4 Ancient Anglo-Saxon Day: Wednesday 12th July 2023



*In support of our curriculum topic for the summer term, **'Invade, Raid, Stayed'**, rather than taking the children on a more costly coach trip to a museum or attraction, we have arranged for the trip to come to us - a company called 'The Specialists' will run a series of fun workshops for the children on Wednesday 12th July.*

Learning outside the classroom or in a workshop format is a valuable and effective means of extending pupil knowledge, enriching pupil understanding and promoting personal and social development. We encourage educational visits and experiences for all our pupils and hope that parents will recognise the value and importance of these visits or events and give them their full support.

*The whole school cost of the day is £357 and includes a whole day of activities. This represents excellent value for money as we won't have to pay for transport (which would be at least £350). The company provide all the resources needed for the children to learn about the Anglo-Saxons. **The day works out at £4 per child and should be paid via your child's ParentPay account by 8th July 2023.***

We believe in the value of these experiences and try to ensure that these opportunities are accessible and affordable to all. However, the school does not have the financial resources to pay for every trip or in-school trip alternative. The contribution is voluntary, and your child will not be excluded if you are unable to contribute. However, please note that without all such voluntary contributions, trips and activities may have to be cancelled, due to a lack of funds. We aim to give the children the best possible chances in their education whilst trying to balance the cost for both ourselves and parents.

We hope that you will support us in this.

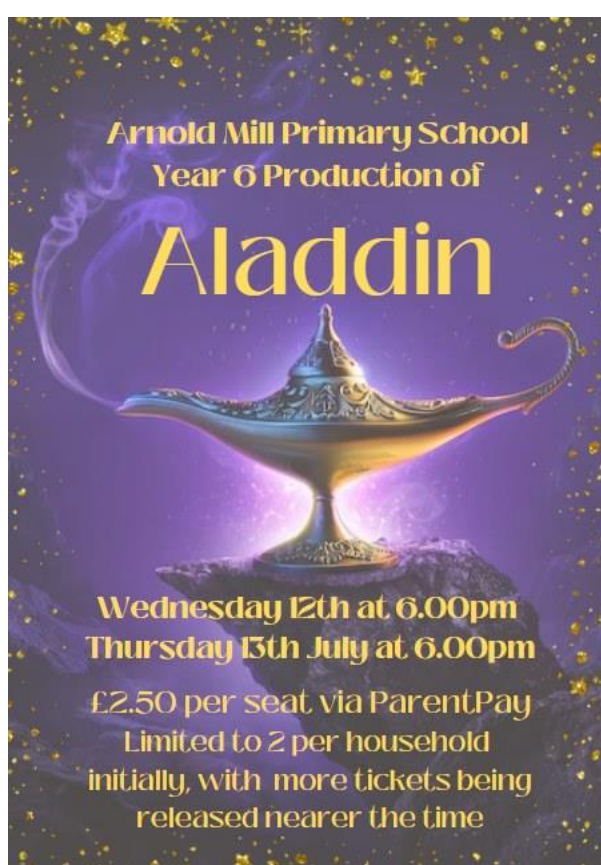

Hearing Checks

Although your child will have routine hearing tests it is important you look out for any hearing problems.

Signs of possible hearing problems:

- ☐ Poor concentration.
- ☐ Talking loudly and listening to the tv at a high volume.
- ☐ Difficulty pin pointing where a sound is coming from.
- ☐ A change in their progress at school.
- ☐ Mispronouncing words.
- ☐ Not responding when their name is called.

Speak to your GP or Health Family Team if you have any concerns. Your child can have a hearing test at any age.

National Child Measurement Programme

To help monitor national trends and to tackle individual problems the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP) measures the height and weight of every child in reception year (aged 4 to 5) and Year 6 (aged 10 to 11 years) in all primary schools.

Trained staff from the Nottinghamshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust carry out the measurements.

If there are any concerns, please speak to your Health Professional.

It is now time for your child's yearly flu nasal spray!

What do you need to do?

You must complete one online consent form for each of your children. It is important every child has a completed form which states if you would like them to receive the flu vaccination spray or not.

How will the vaccination be given to your child?

We are a team of skilled and experienced nurses and support staff. The flu vaccination is a quick and simple spray up the nose.

Step one: The nurse places the tip of a thin plastic tube just inside the nostril. The child can breathe normally whilst the vaccine is given.

Step two: Half of the vaccine is sprayed in one nostril.

Step three: The other half of the vaccine is sprayed into the other nostril.

Air pollution from idling cars can lead to:

- Increased chance of developing lung cancer
- Increased risk of heart disease
- Increase in asthma, coughs and bronchitis

Children

Children are the most at risk because they:

- Have smaller lungs and breathe more rapidly
- Spend more time outdoors
- Tend to be more active and breathe more deeply

How it affects you and others

Excessive idling is a waste of fuel and money, resulting in an unnecessary negative environmental impact.

People inside cars are exposed to high levels of air pollution, with children especially at risk of harmful effects.

Nottinghamshire's air pollution contributes to hundreds of premature deaths each year.



Don't sit there idle

Keeping the engine running while stuck in traffic or waiting to collect someone pollutes the air we breathe.

It's up to all of us

Drivers in Gedling Borough can make some simple changes to improve air quality in the Borough.

Most pollution comes from vehicles and idling produces unnecessary air pollution and wastes fuel.

Schools, hospitals and bus stops in particular are hot spots, as:

- Idling is more likely to happen in these locations
- They have sensitive age groups, such as children and older people.



Switch off when waiting or stuck in a jam.

Switch to cycling or walking for local trips.

Switch to a bus or train when you can for longer journeys

Inspiring Reading

Children need support to develop the habit and love of reading. How can you be their inspiration?

1. Talk about the reader's interests and inclinations - find connected texts that tempt to explore and discuss together.
2. Think about why reading is good for them - focus on intrinsic motivation rather than external rewards.
3. Capitalise on opportunities to share reading thoughts and interests with others - encourage them to notice preference and choice.
4. Find regular opportunities to visit your local/ school library.
5. Make reading time relaxed and interactive - chat about pictures, characters, likes, dislikes and interesting facts.
6. Be a reading detective by investigating the different purposes for reading (e.g. adverts to persuade, news to inform, stories to entertain).
7. Recognise and celebrate diversity in texts - empower reading of magazines, comics and texts that reflect different realities.
8. Invite others into the reading space - share the love of reading together in your reading community!
