
Thank you so much for all the Easter creations, didn't they look lovely! The winning creations are shown below.









Happy Munchkins After School Club has closed with immediate effect



This morning we were informed that Happy Munchkins would no longer be trading on our school site- with immediate effect.

We have managed to arrange a replacement for after Easter which will be held in school and run by our staff. This will be a temporary arrangement until more stable plans can be arranged.

Unfortunately, we cannot arrange holiday cover and so suggest you contact Happy Munchkins for a refund if you have paid upfront for this. We have shared information about local groups who are running holiday activities via our newsletter, should you need an alternative. I'm so sorry this has come with no notice- the situation is completely out of our hands.

Moving forward we will run after school care in the same place we do our breakfast club (the library). If you would like childcare, please pay via ParentPay, upfront. It will be charged at £12 per session

and will run until 6pm. The children will be served food between 4.30 and 5pm. To start with this may be cold food as we need to organise hygiene arrangements, but we will do our best to keep it healthy.

I apologise, on behalf of Happy Munchkins, for any problems this may cause you. However, we will do all we can to ensure we offer wrap around care from after Easter.



School Dinners



Just a couple of polite requests regarding school dinners:

Dinners are ordered by 9.30am each morning, so if your child is going to be late for any reason and requires a school dinner, could you please contact the school on 0115 9667930 to order one before this time.

We get a lot of children putting their name down for the wrong dinner choice in the morning.

Could we ask that parents please speak to children about the importance of knowing whether they are a school dinner or packed lunch when asked at registration, as we cater for the numbers provided.

We often either have a surplus of food (which costs the school money) or don't have enough food.

We don't usually pass this cost onto parents, but we may have to do so in the future.

- I Please ensure that you keep up with payments on ParentPay for school dinners (and tuck) as this should be paid for in advance of having a meal.
- Thildren in Foundation and Key Stage 1 are entitled to Universal Free School Meals but should still apply for benefit related free school meals if you believe they are eligible. This will provide the school with valuable Pupil Premium funding and also means that your child is entitled to free milk, free activities during school holidays, along with other potential benefits. You can check eligibility and apply using this link.
- If providing a packed lunch for your child, please ensure that it does not contain nuts of any type (including Nutella). We would also ask that you don't send sweets, fizzy drinks or energy drinks.
- Please inform the office if your child has any special dietary needs and they will provide you with the relevant paperwork to complete. We can only accept requests on medical/ethical grounds and do not cater for personal preferences/dislikes.



Family Event at Arnold Methodist Church: Thursday 6th April





Eid Mini Fair : Wednesday 26th April



As a school, we like to embrace and celebrate different cultures. As part of Eid celebrations, Mrs Hussain has kindly offered to raise some funds for Key Stage 1 equipment and trips by organising the following:

ACTIVITIES

Henna Tattoo – on 26th April Key Stage 1 and 2 children are invited to have a henna tattoo on their hand. We will be using ready-made henna which can take up to 10 days to fade away. If your child would like a henna tattoo, please make a £1 payment via ParentPay by midnight on 25th April (this will be also be the parental permission form). Payment and permission will be required to enable you child to participate in this activity.

Raffle tickets can be purchased via ParentPay (50p a ticket). Pre-purchased tickets can be collected from the school office from 18th April. Any donations for the raffle would be gratefully received.

Poster Competition – during the lead up to Eid the children are invited to design a poster all about Eid. Entry Forms can be purchased via ParentPay (50p). The posters will be judged on 25th April and five prizes are up for grabs.

F2 Trip to Sherwood Pines: 20th June 2023



We have arranged to take the children from F2 on a visit to Sherwood Pines on Tuesday 20th June 2023. We will be making woodland art, learning about minibeasts and pond dipping. The trip will take place during normal school hours.

The cost of the visit is £12.20 per child payable via ParentPay by 5th June 2023 (we recognise that finances may be stretched, so we have tried to give you as much notice as possible, we have also tried to be flexible by way of offering the option to pay the full amount either in small increments to suit, or in one lump sum). The cost includes the organised activities at Sherwood Pines, hiring a bus and a free packed-lunch (as your child is entitled to Universal Free School Meals).

We will send hard copy trip permission forms and medical information forms for completion nearer the time.

On the day, children will be expected to wear school uniform but can wear trainers or similar comfy shoes, they will also need a drink and a morning snack. If it is very hot they will need a sun hat and have sunscreen applied.

Dear Parents and Carers,

Year 1 visit to Stonebridge City Farm – Monday 3rd July 2023

In support of our curriculum topics for the summer term, 'Growing and Animals' Year 1 children will be visiting Stonebridge City Farm (during normal school hours). During the visit, the children will have the opportunity to feed the animals, take part in a farm, barn and garden led by the farm staff and to play in the play area.

The trip includes a guided tour of the farm, garden and barn, animal feed and the return coach trip.

The cost is £4.90 per child (the cost of this trip is reduced due to Mrs Hussain's fundraising efforts) and should be paid via your child's ParentPay account by 23rd June please.

Useful Information:

- As Year 1 children are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals, Mrs Burrows will be
 providing a packed lunch. Your child will, however, need a drink (no fizzy drinks please) and
 small rucksack to put their lunch in please (they will need to carry their own rucksack on the
 day).
- There is also a gift shop, if your child wishes to bring a small amount of money with them to spend (no more than £5), this is fine. Spending money should be sent in a named purse/wallet and handed to their teacher in the morning.
- The children must come in their school uniform but can wear trainers or suitable footwear for walking around the City Farm.
- If the weather is hot, please ensure they are wearing sun cream and a sunhat. As we will be outside, please send them with an extra layer, just in case it feels chilly in the shade.
- Please pick your child up at normal time from their classroom, we will be returning to school during the early afternoon, depending on traffic, so should be back in plenty of time.
- If your child needs to take any medication with them on this trip (such as inhalers, hayfever
 medicine and travel sickness tablets) you will need to fill out a separate form for each
 medicine and hand the completed form and the medication (in a clear sandwich bag with
 your child's name on it) in on the day.
- A hard copy of the necessary permission form and medication forms will be sent home for you to complete nearer the time.

If you have any questions about the day, please talk to your child's teacher.







Inspiring Reading



Children need support to develop the habit and love of reading. How can you be their inspiration?

- 1. Talk about the reader's interests and inclinations find connected texts that tempt to explore and discuss together.
- Think about why reading is good for them focus on intrinsic motivation rather than external rewards.
 - Capitalise on opportunities to share reading thoughts and interests with others encourage them to notice preference and choice.
 - 4. Find regular opportunities to visit your local/ school library.
 - Make reading time relaxed and interactive chat about pictures, characters, likes, dislikes and interesting facts.
 - 6. Be a reading detective by investigating the different purposes for reading (e.g. adverts to persuade, news to inform, stories to entertain).

 7. Recognise and celebrate diversity in texts - empower reading of

 - magazines, comics and texts that reflect different realities.

 8. Invite others into the reading space share the love of reading together in your reading community!
