# Film Night - Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> November 2023 (Collection times shown below)

We are holding a film night on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> November at 3.30pm for children in F2 to Year 6. The films are due to start straight after school, so the children will be taken directly from their class to the 'cinema screen' by the teachers (they are welcome to bring a small cushion to sit on). The finish time and collection point will vary as shown in the table below. We have chosen shorter films for the younger children, as their attention span is shorter, and they get distracted easily.

Admission is £3.00 payable via ParentPay. Children will be provided with a drink and snack with the remaining money will go to raise funds for our 'Project Playground' appeal (see <u>here</u> for details). The deadline to sign up will be 3.00pm on Thursday  $16^{th}$  November, after which time the finalised attendance list will be printed and passed to staff (for this reason we will NOT be able to accommodate late requests - sorry).

Children in years 5 and 6 are permitted to walk home on their own if parental consent is received via <u>this form</u>. ALL other children must be collected by a responsible adult, *unless* they are booked to go to Millie's After School Club, in which case they will be escorted there by a member of staff.

To keep costs down, we will NOT be issuing tickets. ParentPay will give us an attendance list which allows us to keep a track of numbers for fire regulations and for the staff to know which children to escort to the 'cinema screen'.

We ask that the children observe 'cinema etiquette' at all times during the film, therefore no mobile phones will be allowed.

It is a licensing requirement that this cinema enforces BBFC age ratings. Films shown in public cinemas are rated U, PG, 12A, 15 and 18. All films come with detailed ratings info.

#### U - Universal Suitable for all

A U film should be suitable for audiences aged four years and over, although it is impossible to predict what might upset any particular child. U films should be set within a positive framework and should offer reassuring counterbalances to any violence, threat or horror.



#### PG - Parental Guidance General viewing, but some scenes may be unsuitable for young children

A PG film should not unsettle a child aged around eight or older. Unaccompanied children of any age may watch, but parents are advised to consider whether the content may upset younger or more sensitive children.



#### 12A - Suitable for 12 years and over, unless accompanied by an adult

No one younger than 12 may see a 12A film in a cinema unless accompanied by an adult. Adults planning to take a child under 12 to view a 12A film should consider whether the film is suitable for that child. To help them decide, we recommend that they check the ratings info for the film in advance.



### 15 - Suitable only for 15 years and over

No one younger than 15 may see a 15 film in a cinema. A cinema may lose its licence if it admits children under 15 to a 15 rated film.

No theme is prohibited at 15, provided the treatment is appropriate for 15 year olds. 15 films may contain strong language, violence, sex and drug misuse.



#### 18 - Suitable only for adults

No one younger than 18 may see an 18 film in a cinema. A cinema may lose its licence if

their own viewing decisions, provided the material is legal and does not pose a significant risk of harm. 18 films may contain very strong content that might offend some adult viewers.
