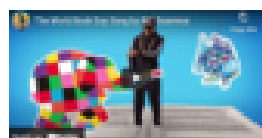


World Book Day Competition



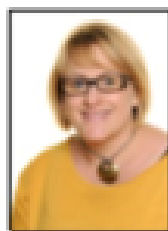

Arnold Mill's Reading Café

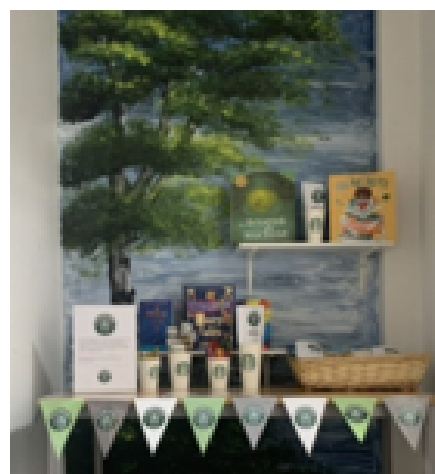

A big thank you to Mrs Moodie and Mr Knight for their amazing work to create this display.

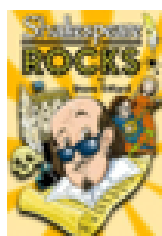
