## **School Clubs - Spring 2025**



We are asking parents to register their children for the clubs which will run in the next term. These clubs are detailed on the next page and will run in two blocks:

- w/c 14th January w/c 3rd February
- w/c 24th February w/c 17th March

Please register your child's interest by completing the form (Link to application form) by **Tuesday 17th December at the very latest**. We are asking you to choose clubs in the order of preference and we will then try to accommodate everyone, as best we can, onto their preferred club. Children may be offered places in more than one club if spaces are available.

We will inform you by Friday 20th December whether your child has been successful.

We would emphasise that if you sign your child up to a club, they should attend every week unless there are exceptional circumstances. Regular non-attendance may mean we offer the place to someone else. We always have children dropping out of the clubs which is very disappointing when other children have missed out. If your child can't make it for any reason, you should let the office know. If school needs to cancel a club, e.g. for staff absence or training, we will email the relevant parents as soon as possible. We will also send a text if

the cancellation is on the actual day of the club. Please ensure that you keep us up to date with your contact details.

## **Applying for Reception Place for September 2025**

Primary School Applications open on Monday 4th November 2024



If your child lives in Nottinghamshire and requires a Reception school place for September 2025, you must apply through Nottinghamshire County Council (applies to children who are five years old between 1 September 2024 and 31 August 2025).

Parents sometimes think that making only one preference will ensure that a place is allocated at that school, that is not the case, and it is very important that you apply on time and identify four preferences.

If your child attends Nursery at Arnold Mill Primary you will need to apply for a school place as you do NOT automatically get offered a school place.

I have worked as a Teaching Assistant at Arnold Mill for 12 years and in more recent years I have gained my level 4 Diploma in Counselling and have worked as School Counsellor

alongside my TA role. I have now decided to make counselling my sole career, but I will still be working very closely with Arnold Mill.

I will be available to carry out 1-1 private counselling, should you feel your child may need support and encouragement for any concerns that you, or they, may have. This could be for bereavement/loss, stress and anxiety or trauma; or you may just feel that talking to an independent Counsellor, other than a family member or friend, would benefit your child.

The sessions will be carried out in the Den where I have a dedicated counselling room which is a comfortable, safe environment, so your child can express their thoughts and feelings confidentially through creativity and talking, with no judgement.

I am very passionate about how important therapy is for children at a young age as this helps to set them up for a positive response to therapy later in life.

## Inspiring Reading



Children need support to develop the habit and love of reading. How can you be their inspiration?

- l. Talk about the reader's interests and inclinations find connected texts that tempt to explore and discuss together.
- Think about why reading is good for them focus on intrinsic motivation rather than external rewards.
  - 3. Capitalise on opportunities to share reading thoughts and interests with others - encourage them to notice preference and choice.

    4. Find regular opportunities to visit your local/school library.

  - Make reading time relaxed and interactive chat about pictures, characters, likes, dislikes and interesting facts.
     Be a reading detective by investigating the different purposes for reading (e.g. adverts to persuade, news to inform, stories to entertain).
     Recognise and celebrate diversity in texts empower reading of

  - magazines, comics and texts that reflect different realities.
