






































Charging for After School Clubs

After years of fighting off budget pressures, we have had to make the difficult decision of charging for after activity and sports school clubs from January 2026.

This is not a decision that was taken lightly, however due to ever increasing costs and decreasing funding we have been left with no choice.

To keep charges as low as possible, we will be charging £10 per half term (4 sessions).

If clubs are cancelled by us for any reason, we will try to rearrange another session that half term to compensate. If this isn't possible, we will either refund or transfer the session amount of £2.50 to your MCAS account.

If your child cannot make a session for any reason, unfortunately we are not able to refund as the place won't be reallocated and the club will still be running.

Children will be able to sign up to as many clubs as they wish after school. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis and registration will be via MCAS.

A letter will be sent out over the coming weeks giving details of January's clubs so please keep an eye out!


We're also going to be at the at the Christmas Fair on 28th November (located in Class 2b).
















1 - We are also seeking donations of Christmas decorations.

Our Christmas Fair is cash free, instead we sell blue tokens (for £1 you will receive two blue tokens worth 50p each) which can be spent at the various stalls (for example, a tombola ticket may be 3 tokens).

- Blue tokens are available to pre-purchased tokens via MCAS. These can be collected from the school office (by an adult) – please allow 24 hours to enable your transaction to be processed.
- At lunchtime on the day of the Christmas Fair any uncollected, pre-purchased tokens and raffle tickets will be taken to your child's class (to go into their bookbag).
- Tokens can also be purchased at the Christmas Fair (the queue at that stall can get quite long which is why we recommend that you purchase them in advance via MCAS).
- Please note some stalls at the Christmas Fair are run by external providers, they
 have the option to accept cash, card payments (they may or may not accept blue
 tokens).
- Unused tokens can either be saved for the Summer Fair or returned to the school office by 31st January for a refund

Admission price includes a biscuit and unlimited water or juice.


We will NOT be issuing tickets to keep costs down, MCAS will give us an attendance list so we will just tick the children off as they come in, this also allows us to keep track of numbers for fire regulations and for the staff to know which children to escort from their class to the Disco at the end of the school day.

After the disco children should be collected from their normal classroom (approx 4.30pm).

Children booked to go to Millie's will be escorted there by a member of staff.







Year 4 Residential Visit to Lea Green Outdoor Activity Centre (Places still available- book via MCAS)

Due to last year's residential being such a resounding success, in March 2026 (Tuesday 24th – Wednesday 25th), we have arranged to take Year 4 children on a residential visit to Lea Green Outdoor Activity Centre in Derbyshire.

Going on a residential to Lea Green is a fantastic experience for children as it has so many activities to offer and the staff who run it are brilliant at making sure the children have the best time possible. The children will have a full two-day learning experience with one night staying over at Lea Green.

The grounds at Lea Green are extensive and staying in such a grand house, which was built in 1761, is an experience in itself.

The activities the children will take part in are:

- Orienteering
- Low ropes obstacle course
 - Bushcraft
 - Go-karting
- Problem solving team challenges
 - Co-operative games.

There will also be lots of opportunities for children to have free time and use the different facilities at the centre to enable them to wind down at the end of a busy day. The facilities include a games room (table football, pool tables, various games etc.), a sports hall, play ground and of course a shop.

The children will also take part in an ambush type game where the staff are the catchers – my favourite activity.

The cost of the trip will be £141 and includes includes transport to and from school to Lea Green, meals, bedding, use of all the facilities and activities led by the staff at the centre.

We hope that as many of Year 4 as possible can come (45 places have been booked as last year we took every member of Year 4).

We have set up a payment plan as follows:

*£50 non-refundable deposit Friday 31st October

* £30 non-refundable instalment Friday 28th November

*£30 non-refundable instalment Friday 30th January

*£31 non-refundable final payment Friday 27th February

Please note that all payments must be paid by the due dates at the very latest.

When you pay the £50 deposit, you secure the place and are making a commitment for your child to attend, and you are agreeing to pay the remaining balances by their due dates. If your child decides they no longer want to attend, a refund will not be issued and any remaining balance will still need to be paid, unless a replacement can be found.

There will be a parents' information meeting after school on Thursday 5th February, this will cover kit list and medical requirements etc.

Trends

What?

- Kids are taking advantage of AI-generated images by sending their parents fake pictures of unhoused people in the family's house or car, sometimes even causing parents to call the police.
- People are also using AI to create images and videos of people who are deceased, including public figures like Robin Williams and John Lennon. Sora recently banned deepfakes of Martin Luther King Jr., but it's unclear how further bans might be applied.

Now What?

- Both trends invite discussions about ways AI can be useful and ways it can cause harm: Though these examples may seem relatively harmless, what are the consequences? How about future implications?
- Talk about how AI is moving faster than we're regulating it: Based on what we're seeing, what regulations should be created? How can we, personally, prevent harms caused by AI?

Don't think that just because your child isn't creating these things doesn't mean they won't come across videos of other people who are doing it.

As always - keep talking to your children about what they are doing and seeing online.

Taking an active interest in their online experiences always increases the chances of being able to support them better and keep them safe.
