

Milk and Water Bottles

Your child is entitled to free milk until their 5th birthday. This has to be ordered online each term.





We ask all children to bring a labelled water bottle to school every day and we teach the children to keep themselves hydrated as part of our health and self-care curriculum.

Only water is allowed in the bottle, no juice or flavoured water please.

OPAL Lunch Time

The F2 children have their lunch together in the hall. Lunch time starts at 11.50am.

The children can have a school dinner which is free or bring a packed lunch.

When the children have finished their lunch they use the KS1 outdoor area.

In January they will have access to all of the school grounds and the OPAL equipment.

Fruit

During the afternoon we eat a piece of fruit at story time. This is a free entitlement.



Reading Books

- All children will bring home a story book to share with you at home. When they are ready to have one they will bring a reading book and a Read Write book home.
- We will change your child's reading books once each week.
- Your child will get a star in their reading diary each week if they read at least three times at home. This has to be signed by an adult.
- When they reach a reading milestone they will be awarded a prize. There are three to collect during the year - bronze, silver and gold.




After a settling in period the children will start their daily Read! Write! lessons. This is a systematic phonics programme that teaches reading and writing. We use it throughout Foundation and Key Stage 1.



The children will not bring home a Read! Write! book until they are able to blend words to read.

Forming Letters





Forest Fridays

We do get messy!








AMPs Awards

The children take part in the whole school reward system.

They will be awarded AMPs awards for showing one of our school values. A raffle ticket will be awarded and put into a whole school box. Tickets are pulled out of the box on a Friday, and the winning children receive a prize.



Rainbow Rewards

Each child has a star card to collect stars on. They are awarded a star each time they try their best when completing work or follow the classroom rules. When they have collected 20 stars on their star card, they receive a certificate. There are 7 coloured stars to

collect.



House Points

Each child in school is part of a house team, these are named after local historical people. House points are awarded when the children show that they are working together as a team.

Assessment and Progress

- We will keep records of your child's progress through the Foundation Stage. During the first half-term, we complete a baseline assessment of your child to go with the information we receive from your child's previous setting. This is a statutory assessment called the Reception Baseline and is reported to the Department for Education.
- Each child will be given a Class Dojo account. We will
 post class messages and photographs for you to keep
 up to date with your child's experiences at school.
- There will be 2 parent's evenings during the year.

Starting Reception

Your child's journey to school starts at home

We understand that all children develop at their own pace, and that we're all learning from birth. When it's time to start school, some children will need more help than others.

There's lots you can do at home to build your child's confidence and independence, helping them feel emotionally and practically prepared to start school.



Settling in days

- Tuesday 15th July all children will visit for the morning from 9.45am-11.15am
- Wednesday 3rd September children will stay for the morning in their classes from 9.00am to 11.30am
- Thursday 4th September- 9.00am to 1.00pm
 Children will stay for the morning and stay for lunch.
 They will go home for the afternoon.
- Friday 5th September Children will start full-time from 8.50am - 3.30pm
