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Dear Year, 3 and 4 Parent/Carer,

As you may be aware, the Department for Education introduced statutory guidelines for RSHE (Relationships, Sex and Health Education) across both primary and secondary education from 2020. Relationships and Health Education is compulsory for all pupils receiving primary education. Learning about the emotional, social and physical aspects of growing up will give children and young people the information, skills and positive values to have safe, fulfilling relationships and will help them take responsibility for their own well-being.

In the coming weeks, Year 3 and 4 will be taking part in special, age appropriate, RSHE lessons. All children will be involved in these lessons and will be taught by teachers within the Year 3/4 team.

We recognise that parents play a vital part in their child's RSHE, and we would encourage you to talk to your children at home beforehand should you wish, and about what they have learnt in school; exploring any further questions they may have. We will answer children's questions in school if they are relevant to our teaching and age appropriate. Any other questions, we will explain to the child that they can either ask a trusted adult at home or wait until they are older.

Children cannot be withdrawn from these lessons as they form part of the statutory RSE and Science curriculum.
