Cumbrian Agreed Syllabus: Increasing numbers of schools across Cumbria are including detailed learning about Hindu Dharma in their medium-term plans in light of the new Cumbrian Agreed Syllabus for RE. It is encouraging to see schools reflecting on the changing religious demographic of their school community and reviewing which religions are taught in detail, especially for KS1 and KS2 pupils. Some exciting opportunities have opened up for our schools through the North West RE Hubs to encounter Hindu school speakers and visits to Hindu temples in Preston, Southport and Newcastle.

Crosby on Eden CE School were recently joined by Aruna Patel and her 10 year old son Pavan (on his half term holiday) to enrich their learning about **Diwali**, the Hindu religious festival of light. The 5 days of Diwali are a major Hindu festival and also celebrated by other Dharmic faiths such as Jains, Sikhs and some Buddhists. Each religion marks different historical events and stories. SACRE Hindu member, Rashmi Manemi has kindly offered classroom-based assemblies about Diwali using a presentation from the Hindu Education Board. Such opportunities are memorable and enable pupils to encounter and ask questions about lived and local experience.
