David has served as a governor at Arnside National School for over 20 years. MS JACKI PIPER

MRS CARLA HARTROPP



Jacki Piper is deputy head teacher at Arnside National School, promoted to this post on 1st September 2017.

She was welcomed onto the board of governors in November 2017. She has worked as a teacher in the school since 1993. She has responsibility for Leadership of English, Geography and Music in the school. She has previously had responsibility for the leadership of PE and RE and took on the role of SENCO for a year. In 1999 Jacki did an educational exchange to Waitara Central School in New Zealand through the Commonwealth Exchange Scheme.

For eight years, Jacki was on the board of trustees for Old Hutton Preschool, where she had responsibility for being treasurer and educational advisor. Jacki is Specialist Leader in Education for English and NQTs. In this role, she runs a support group for English Leaders, providing training and moderation experiences. In the school's role as teaching school up until 2016, Jacki was responsible for the Newly Qualified Teachers across the SLRP network. In this role, she moderated assessments, collated data, and provided training and support for the new teachers in South Lakeland.

Jacki has taken on responsibility for curriculum development in the school, providing training on pedagogy and curriculum design in order to help staff work together to create a whole school curriculum map for all subjects. This will provide continuity and progression, allowing the children to make cognitive links within and between subjects, which will enhance the quality of their education.

GOVERNANCE PROFESSIONAL TO THE GOVERNING BOARD MRS SUE GLENDINNING



Sue has served as a school Governor for 26 years, in three schools within the Carlisle area of the county. She served for 18 years at Belle Vue Primary School, being Chair of Governors for 10 years.

During this time, she was chair of the staffing & finance committee and the premises, health & safety committee. Sue also served on the board of governors at a small rural primary school to the north of the county at Fir Ends Primary School, for 6 years, where she was vice chair of governors and chair of the staffing, finance, premises, health & safety committee: official complaints committee and the staff redundancy committee. Sue's governance experience is not limited to primary education, as she was a member appointed governor at Trinity School in Carlisle, the largest secondary school in the county. During her 6-year tenure here, she was Chair of the Finance & General-Purpose Committee and served on the student disciplinary and exclusion panel and the headteacher appointment panel.

Sue has been the Chair of Finance, Staffing, Premises, Health and Safety Committees for 25 years.

Sue has been the director of Cumbria Clerking Advisory Service, since 2012. This followed her 13 years' service with the local education authority, where as a Governor Development Officer, she was responsible for developing and delivering training to governors countywide, and for working with governing bodies to raise their standards of leadership and management in governance. She also mentored newly appointed chairs of governors.

Sue moved from Newcastle to Carlisle to start her career as a nurse, then trained as a midwife in Scotland.

Sue worked in East Anglia and completed her Neonatal Intensive Care qualification before returning to Cumbria to work as a Community Midwifery Sister and midwifery tutor. Following her time spent raising her children, Sue did further training, which enabled her to work in school with children with special educational needs, and those requiring 1-1 tuition in English and maths. She worked in a local primary school for three years in Year 1 and Year 6, before being asked to join the Governor Development Team at Cumbria County Council.
