

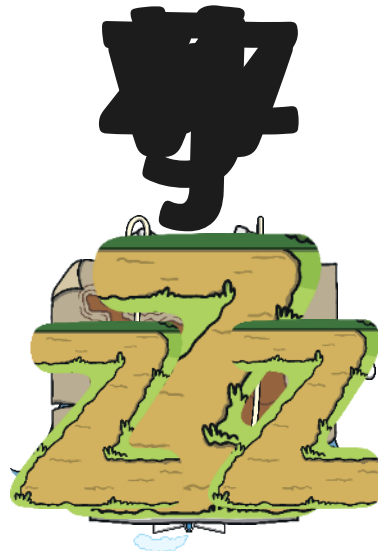

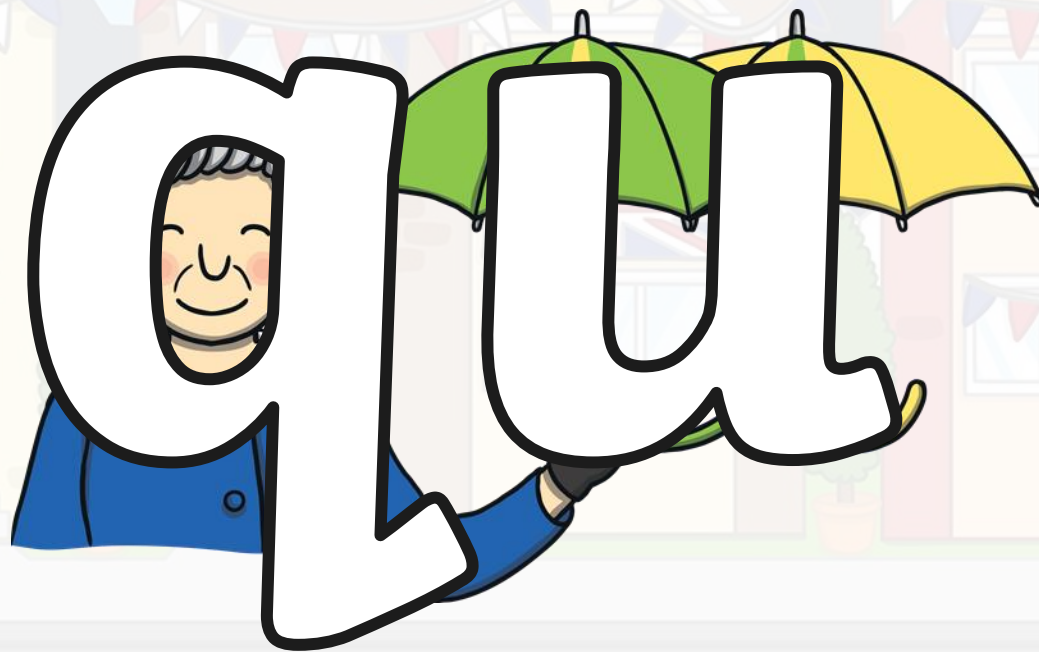
It was **an** exciting day. **The** queen was coming **to visit** **Kit and Sam's** town! The family **had** decorated their house with flags **and** bunting.

Give a royal wave.

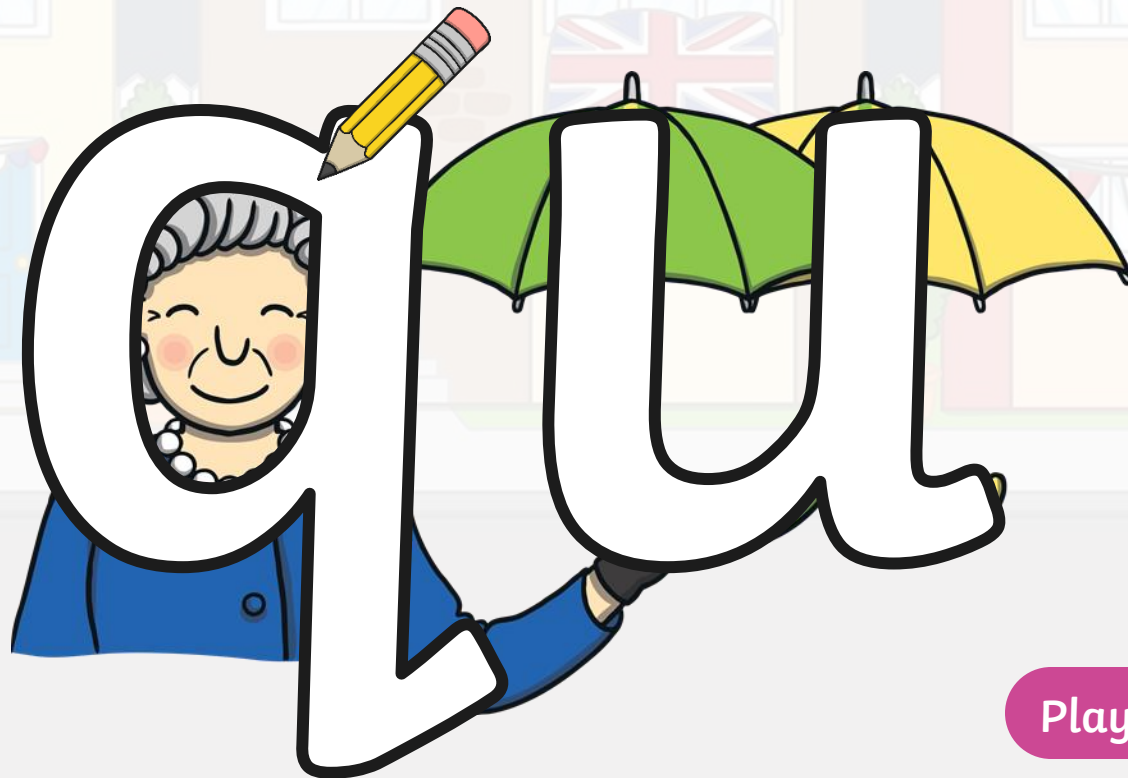


Say 'qu, qu, qu'.

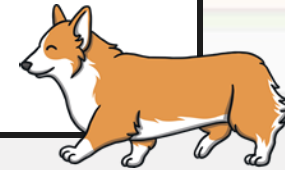

Somebody tell her!



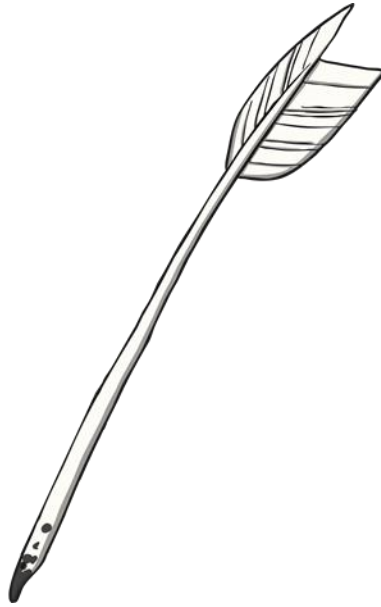
