Schools expecting SIAMS 2018-19

The new SIAMS schedule came into force on 1st September 2018. The schedule and SEF document can be accessed via Carlisle Diocese website. Any schools due to be inspected this year will have already received an email from Deborah Smith, Deputy Director, informing them and requesting details of any residential trips they are involved in. Inspections within Carlisle Diocese will take place during the Spring and Summer terms for this year **ONLY**. This is so we can support schools in using the new framework. We have already run a full day's training for head teachers/senior leaders last term. If you missed this I advise you to sign up for the Diocesan module 'Preparing for Diocesan Inspection' on 16th October 6.30pm-8.30pm at Church House. For those schools being inspected this academic year we are offering a FREE training session to look specifically at using the new SEF. This session will take place at Church House, Penrith on Wednesday 26th September 6pm-8pm. Please contact Morven Anson education@carlislediocese.org.uk to confirm attendance.

Understanding Christianity

Several schools have enquired regarding the Understanding Christianity project. We are pleased to say we will be running another round of training this academic year. Full details are in the attached flyer. (click here) Those schools who have completed the training already (around 50 across the Diocese) have found it has helped develop their teaching of Christianity as well as supported teacher's and pupils' subject knowledge and this has been acknowledged by SIAMS inspectors. We are delivering the course at an incredible £175 per school. You are welcome to bring your whole school staff for the one price. This will provide a set of the core materials and access to the Understanding Christianity website.







The Church of England Professional Qualification for Headship Applications for 2019/20 are now open and will close on Friday 2nd November 2018.

The Church of England Professional Qualification for Headship (CofEPQH) provides rigorous preparation for senior leaders preparing for their first headship, heads leading both primary and secondary schools for the first time, and heads who have not yet completed the NPQH.

By completing your NPQH with the Church of England not only will you achieve a nationally recognised qualification you be equipped to know how to translate the Church of England Vision for Education into reality within your school and be enlivened in your own vocation.

News from Trinity School—Caroline Kennedy, School Chaplain

Lunchtime Christian Union groups are growing. Meetings are both relaxed and lively. Students who are committed Christians and those without any commitment seem to enjoy coming to think through challenges and play games. The groups have now moved to our designated Prayer/Quiet Space in the library, and there will be an official opening of this in the Autumn. Thanks go to the NISCU workers who come in to school regularly to run the CU, and to take part in assemblies.

We hope that our Prayer Space will be a wellspring in school: a place where students can express their feelings, experience silence, find encouragement, think critically, grow in hope, understand and glimpse their gifts, bring their questions. A place they can own and access easily. Easier to get to than the Cathedral, it will be a closer to home place during the day. The beauty, history and space of the Cathedral continues to be a vitally important place for us to visit and learn about. Links with the Cathedral and its staff remain strong and are to be developed further. Many of our students have gone there to light candles and spend quiet time after bereavements, and this is something we want to keep as a valuable offering to students in a Church School, as well as building on our Year 7 visits and their Welcome Service held in the Cathedral itself. We also want to encourage students to see the Cathedral as a space they can visit themselves outside school hours.

When nominating Foundation Governors the PCC is asked to ensure that the nominated person completes a Foundation Governor nomination form and ensures that it is returned to the Diocesan Director of Education. The governor is not appointed and may not serve on the governing body until s/he has received formal notification from the Diocesan Director. This applies equally to Foundation

A Protected People

The LORD watches over you – the LORD is your shade at your right hand; the sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon by night. The LORD will keep you from all harm – he will watch over your life; the LORD will watch over your coming and going both now and for evermore.

Psalm 121:5-8

Of course, like other psalms, they have a reach beyond their original setting, down through the ages, even to us who journey not to the temple but to God himself. Indeed, with its final promise that 'the LORD will watch over your coming and going both now and for evermore', something of those extended implications are already being worked out in the psalm itself.

That word 'watch' or 'keep' – which appears six times in the psalm – echoes the priestly blessing in Numbers 6:24: 'the LORD bless you and *keep* you'. The promise originally given to those on a journey through the wilderness is here reapplied to God's pilgrim people in subsequent generations.

With some exceptions, the relative comfort and ease with which we undertake journeys today – in air-conditioned cars, high-speed trains, and planes which cross continents and oceans – means that some of the force of the psalm might be lost on us. Here's a prayer which anticipates a long journey over difficult terrain where ankles can easily get twisted, where bandits might lie in wait, not to mention the heat of the day and the anxieties which come with the night.

For them, the promise of help comes from the Lord, 'the maker of heaven and earth', the keeper of Israel who doesn't slumber or sleep. As they make their way to Jerusalem – and as they walk the path of life – he will not let their feet slip.

For us, too, the journey will involve challenges, even ominous or scary moments. But we, too, travel with others. And we claim the same promise, so amazingly comprehensive in its scope, which reaches into the whole of life – 'Life in all its fullness'.
