Spelling — Class 2 children know they are a 'Diamond' or a 'Sapphire' or a 'Ruby'. <u>If they have forgotten, let me know!</u> Class 1, Year 1 children all should use the 'Diamond' spelling words.

<u>Y1</u> In English over the next couple of weeks we are going to be looking at stories and information books with a winter theme.

As an introduction to the topic, we would like you to go on a winter senses walk or explore your garden looking for signs of winter.

What can you see? What can you hear? What can you feel? What can you smell?

If possible, take photographs of the things you see.



<u>Y2 – Lesson: 1 The Secret of Black Rock (Story writing)</u>

This series of lessons will be live streamed from a teacher named Mrs Considine (Mrs C) on her You Tube channel every day from 9:45-10:45 today or you can view them at any time after that. Parents, the children are used to a similar format with me, but may need your support at first.

I have saved some templates in the resources folder. 1 page is for our 'thinking side' where children will write words to use in their writing. The other page is lined for writing their sentences on, the 'writing side'. Each day they will need new pieces and they lay them side by side (thinking side on the left and writing side on the right)



(2) Twinkl Live Lessons: Phase 5 Phonics - 'ea' saying 'ee' #1 - YouTube - from 7 minutes.

Read the 'ea' postcard from the resources and highlight all the 'ea' words you can find.

Green — 'wh' saying /w/

Practise with Mr Thorne wh spelling - Mr Thorne Does Phonics - Bing video Can you write some of the words he uses in a sentence? Try to write two or three sentences.

Remember to start with a capital letter, use spaces, punctuation and read it back to check it makes sense!

Blue — Adding —ed and —er to words ending in e. Watch the twinkl pp. Now find the Fire Fighter Fixers activity. Add the —ed suffix but remember to take the e off first! Write the correct —ed word into the sentences and then have a go at the 'Local Heroes' challenge!



Phonics





Phonics

Yellow — Practice writing the words 'Mr' and 'Mrs' Think of some people who you know that use these titles and write them down, e.g.: Mr Sharp, Mrs Pearce.

Play 'Tricky Word Trucks' on phonics play <u>Tricky Word Trucks</u> (<u>phonicsplay.co.uk</u>) Try phase 4 first then phase 5. We haven't learnt all of the phase 5 words yet but it is good to have a practice.

Find, Speech Bubble Words in the folder and think about what the boy is saying and write the words to match the picture. Then write your own sentence using as many 'wh' words as you can!

Blue — Root words, find 'Root Word Cards' in the folder.

- 1. Read all of the cards and highlight to your child that the words that are made from the same root word (a match).
- 2. Lay out the cards on the table of floor face down.
- 3. Players take turns to turn over 2 cards. If they are formed from the same root word, it's a match and the words are kept by the player. If not, the cards are turned back over.
- 4. The next player takes their turn.
- 5. The winner is the player with the most matches.

Ask your child, 'Do we have a Superkid in this house?' How does the boy in the story become Superkid? E.g. He takes action/he thinks about other people. e.g. he tries the disliked vegetables at Auntie's house.

When have you been a superhero? Share stories together with your child.

Then suddenly 'discover' a letter (see resource folder). Create suspense and surprise as you unfold it to read it aloud to your child. A couch potato! Can a couch potato (CP) become a superhero? We need to give him some advice but what should we tell him? Write a letter back to him and include a sentence about the following; the importance of exercising, the importance of keeping clean, the importance of eating healthily etc

Write a list of five rules the bear could have for his winter house. Follow the sentence writing steps discussed earlier this week. Make it into a proper sign that could be added to a den!


