Topic – PSHE

Aiming High: What is a Star Quality?



We know that we are all Superheroes who are unique, so let’s see how we can identify **Star Qualities** in ourselves and others and think about what we would like to develop in ourselves. For example, sometimes I feel shy when I met new people, so I would like to become more confident to speak to new friends!

Display the Big Questions on the **Lesson Presentation** and allow your child some time to talk about these.

Read the given information to explain what a star quality is. Read the illustrated qualities together. Does your child know what they all mean? Can they describe each one?

Ask your child what star qualities they think they have. They can do this by drawing or writing. They should record as many qualities as they can, using paper and colourful pens. Ask the children to share their thoughts and emphasise that recognising our strengths can encourage feelings of happiness and self-confidence, particularly in troubling times.



You could use the internet like Sarah and Duck in the video above or an information book! You could draw a picture in the middle of your page and write 3 or 4 facts around the edge. Have fun!

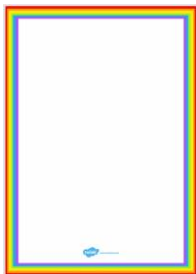
You will notice that [Fox](#), [The Tin Forest](#) and [The Whales's Song](#) all describe wild landscapes and creatures.

You could say, *'I think Fox is a good book'* but could you use a more powerful word than good? For example; amazing, incredible, brilliant, fabulous, wonderful, excellent, terrific. Look at the **reasons table**, in the resources folder, can you give a reason? For example, *'It has incredible illustrations in it of animals and the Australian outback.'*

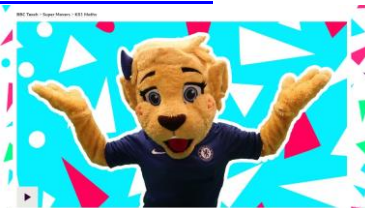


