Message from the Headteacher, Miss Asquith


We opened the consultation on Friday last week to explore whether we should convert to academy status.

"We designed a theme park based around foods like fish 'n' chips. I was expecting the event to be lots of writing but really enjoyed it and hardly wrote anything".




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




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FIT FRIDAY AT ASHTON




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GETTING FIT AT ASHTON
