

INCLUSION & DIVERSITY

We are a fully inclusive school and believe everyone can make a positive contribution to the school community. Our community is rich in its diversity and we celebrate the variety, challenge, acceptance, culture and ideas this brings to each student.

Our School Council is the channel for the student voice in school and meets regularly, influencing many aspects of day to day life in school from facilities refurbishment through to staff appointments and everything in between.

Central to our school ethos is community and our community is inclusive in its diversity. We welcome international students from around the world and have in school support to make the transition and settling in process as smooth as possible.

We have students who are deaf or hearing impaired, students with speech and language delay and students with a variety of other physical, emotional and learning needs. There is one common factor which unites them all: they are all Ashton Community Science College students and we want the very best for each and every one of them. Here everyone is valued equally.

One unique feature of our school is the onsite SERF (Special Education Resource Facility) which supports our deaf students. Deaf students are placed in main school tutor groups alongside their hearing peers. Although they are taught by

the school's subject teachers, working in mainstream classes, for the majority of the time specialist staff provide support to ensure their specific needs are taken into account.

Our Learning Support team offer additional support to students with learning needs across the widest spectrum, working hard to build relationships that help each child achieve their full potential.

Our Gifted, Able and Talented programme continues to go from strength to strength, with all subject areas offering extension activities in addition to the established enrichment programme.



PARTICIPATION TALENT & LEADERSHIP

From the moment students walk through our doors want them to become lifelong learners and successful members of the wider community.

Our careers education, information and guidance programme is comprehensive, giving students an opportunity to reflect on their own career aspirations and the steps they need to take to achieve them. We offer students opportunities which help them become thoughtful, helpful and proactive members of the school and wider community so that by the time they leave Ashton Community Science College, we know we have prepared them for all the challenges they will face as citizens of the future.

At Ashton Community Science College we aim to build on our strengths; we have tried hard to devise a curriculum that suits the needs of all students across the two key stages and that meets the challenges of the 21st Century. HOUSE SYSTEM

The House System at Ashton gives students the opportunity to work together with their peers and members of staff under their own House banner throughout the year. Our house competitions run throughout the year with regular house challenges throwing down the gauntlet to staff and students alike to compete against opposing houses in an effort to earn valuable points for the ongoing House Championship. Other challenges all count towards the points for the House Championship scoreboard. In addition, rewards for good behaviour, work and effort all earn additional points to tally up. Each academic year culminates in our annual Challenge Week, which epitomises the ethos of our House system in encouraging students to work with other members of the school community for a common goal.

At Ashton, we believe our House system leads to the development of many valuable life-skills for our students. From team work and cooperation to resilience and endeavour, we guarantee the year's activities will provide a challenge for everyone.

The house system crosses all year groups so students will interact, make friends and work with students older and younger than themselves. They will also learn something of responsibility to others through the group work ethic this system engenders.



REWARDS

At Ashton, we firmly believe that our students' successes and achievements should be rewarded and celebrated. We recognise and praise hard work, effort, commitment and excellent outcomes. This is key to encouraging students to go further and achieve things they may not even have thought possible.

Our rewards system at Ashton has a number of strands. Our A*shton Learner awards are central to our rewards system. Each student can collect rewards in school for showing qualities in each of the following areas:

Attitude to Learning – do you have a positive mindset towards your learning?

Subject Specific Skills – do you use your talents in particular subjects?

Helpful in School – are you someone who is always willing to lend a hand?

Targets – are you achieving your academic targets in your lessons?

Organised and Ready to Learn – do you always have your equipment and are you on time?

Next Challenge – how are you moving yourself forwards with something to aim for?

Students are awarded with an A*shton Learner award at bronze, silver or gold level once they have collected the required number of rewards in each category.

During the year, rewards are given at half-termly intervals for punctuality and attendance. Rewards trips are offered at the end of every term for students with outstanding records. At Ashton, we are determined that great performances get their deserved reward and that students learn that hard work is the key to success.

PASTORAL, COMMUNITY FUNDRAISING

At Ashton Community Science College, we believe in promoting the highest standards of pastoral care. To complement the challenge of our academic and extra-curricular activities, our pastoral offer delivers support for students and parents alike helping them to thrive throughout their journey with us.

We believe that there is no more important role for us to play than that of preparing young people successfully for the next stages in their lives. SCIENCE TECHNOLOGY ENGINEERING & MATHEMATICS

STEM enrichment at Ashton aims to enthuse, inspire, develop and nourish all students' STEM skills in order to prepare them for the workplace in an ever changing economy, where Science and innovation take a central role. Students are therefore fully prepared and skilled up giving them that extra edge when it comes to application and interview processes when they finally leave us to continue their study or join the workforce.

Our curriculum includes hands on STEM activity days, guest speakers, residential trips including indoor sky diving as well as after school clubs.

STEM partnership links with colleges, UCLan and local industries are strong and as a result provide opportunities for our students to get a glimpse of what further studies of STEM Post 16 will encompass as well as possible career paths. Some of our students get to complete a week's work experience in Engineering.


