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As November draws to a close, I write to update you on matters relating to the remainder of this half term and invite you to share your views and inform our future mobile phone policy by taking part in a short survey.

Mobile phone consultation

We are currently reviewing our mobile phone policy and would like to gather your views. Our proposal is that mobile phone use is banned within the confines of the school grounds and school building. Phones will be switched off and kept in bags from entering the premises to exiting. Currently, students are allowed to use their phones in outside areas and in the dining room. They are prohibited from using them in other areas of school. Whilst many students use their phones responsibly, we have seen a rise in the number of inappropriate uses and have had to deal with the distress this causes. Safeguarding all members of our school family is a priority and the current mobile phone policy compromises our ability to do that. With 800 students on site, it is impossible to monitor their mobile phone use and I know from the many conversations that have been held with parents/carers, you share that particular frustration. Students are taught how to manage their digital life safely and respectfully within the curriculum, but in spite of this they sometimes fall short of expectations. We do appreciate that having a mobile phone offers reassurance to parents and students when travelling to and from school, and there is no intention to ban mobile phones in school completely. The intention of this proposal is to ban their use **during the school day** in all areas. Phones will remain in bags and not be brought out at any time during the day in school or on the school grounds.

A more detailed rationale can be found within the survey, as well as the opportunity to share your thoughts. I am grateful for your responses. The survey will remain open until Wednesday 1st December at 9am.

School uniform, make up and jewellery

I would like to start off by thanking you for the support you have always given regarding school uniform and standards of dress. The way students present themselves is important and many of our students present themselves in a smart way that is entirely within the expectations and limits of the uniform code. As often happens though, at certain times throughout the year, a small number of students are failing to comply with these expectations and are falling far short of what they know is required. As we draw closer to Christmas, I am aware a number of students are pushing boundaries regarding uniform, make up and jewellery, and I appreciate your support in helping us maintain our high standards. I would like to ask for your further support in reinforcing the school's position on standards of dress. I attach a uniform list at the end of this letter so that you are clear what is expected. Specifically, I would like to draw attention to girl's school trousers, make up and jewellery. Our policy regarding jewellery and make up is clear; students should refrain from wearing make-up of any sort, including but not limited to false eyelashes, false nails and fake tan. The only jewellery permitted is a small pair of stud earrings and a wristwatch. All other forms of jewellery, including facial and tongue piercings, are not permitted.

We do have a bank of second hand school uniform that has been donated to school by former students and are happy to supply parents with uniform from this bank either on loan or permanently, free of charge, if replacing incorrect uniform presents a financial challenge. Please contact your child's progress leader if you would like to take advantage of this offer.

Laptops and internet access

We have been allocated a small number of laptops and routers by the DFE for students who do not have access to technology at home. If you feel your child would benefit from accessing either or both of these latest allocations, please contact your child's progress leader.
