Recycling: Ink Cartridges



Why Recycle?

Recycling is the process of collecting and processing materials that would otherwise be thrown away as waste and turning them into new products. Recycling can benefit your community and the environment.



- 300 million inkjets sold in Europe per year
- Only **15% of all inkjets** sold are remanufactured
- 45 million cartridges end up in landfill in the UK
- Cartridges can take up to **1000 years** to decompose
- The lifespan of ink cartridges can be optimised by reusing & recycling them as many times as possible
- Recycling plastic takes **88% less energy** than making plastic from raw materials

Recycling: Ink Cartridges



- 90% of people say they would recycle more if it were made easier
- A recycled product can be back on the shelves again within a single month
- Recycling creates **6 times more jobs** than landfilling and 36 times more than incinerating


Just bring your used ink cartridges into school and drop them into the recycling box by the School Council noticeboard. Any funds raised will be credited to the School Council.
