PE & Sports Premium 2019 – 2020 Intended Pupil Impact	
1	All primary pupils experience coaching in at least one new activity
2	All primary pupils have the opportunity to participate in intra-school sport.

Summary of Impact

1. All primary pupils experience coaching in at least one new activity

Prior to lockdown, 3 classes had **received** CSSP coaching in school in accessing new activities within: Fundamental Movement skills, Gymnastics, Dance and Athletics.

33 pupils have accessed new competitive opportunities in: Boccia, Kurling, Multi Skills OAA and Athletics

2. All primary pupils have the opportunity to participate in intra-school sport.

5 Intra competitions and Festivals events were planned over the academic year, however, as a result of the current health situation we could only participate in 3 events.

30 pupils attended these events which represents 45% of the primary population.

3. Identified Primary pupils have the opportunity to compete at inter-school level.

100% of Primary pupils had the opportunity to participate in the inter school events that were planned.

5 events were planned for the academic year, however as a result of the current health situation only 3 events were attended.

40 pupils attended these events which represents 70% of the primary population, an increase on last year's figure of 61%.

A further 5 Intra competitions and Festivals events were planned over the same time frame. However, as a result of the current health situation we could only participate in 3 events.

30 pupils attended these events which represents 45% of the primary population

4. Primary pupils have the opportunity to access specialist coaching via community clubs.

20 identified pupils attended Young Leaders workshops, gaining confidence to participate in new sports and act as a leader in the school setting.

5. All Primary Pupils to receive high quality PE lessons delivered with confidence.

100% of Primary teachers have received coaching sessions from CSSP prior to lockdown. Previous CPD questionnaire identified that teachers felt that they required more training in the delivery of:

- Fundamental movement skills
- Dance.
- Balance bikes.

100% teachers reported an increase in confidence across these areas.

6. All Primary pupils participate in regular cycling activities as part of a healthy lifestyle.

4 Balance bike sessions delivered to 50 pupils which represents 80% of pupils.

Service contract has been secured to maintain the cycle stock, which will ensure they are made available to pupils in a safe condition.

11 Bikes to be purchased, this will allow a whole class to access them.

Supply identified and bikes to be purchased after lockdown.

7. All primary pupils have the opportunity to participate in at least two appropriate outdoor and adventurous activities.

Providers identified but unable to complete **due to lockdown**.

8. All year 6 pupils to have the opportunity to participate in an OAA residential.

Providers identified but unable to complete **due to lockdown**.

9. All primary pupils make use of stimulating and structured outdoor play facilities for 30 minutes daily during break times.

100% of primary classes have provided evidence to support the participation of pupils during active lessons and playtimes.

Robust equipment has been purchased to accommodate the use by pupils during these times.

10. Identified pupils have improved their ability to self and mutually regulate.

100% pupils identified participated in sensory circuits daily. Prior to lockdown (Feb 2020) 72% were on track to meet their Physical and Sensory End of Year Outcome. 16% of those identified pupils had exceeded their Outcome. The teachers of 94% of identified pupils reported an increase in readiness to learn following sensory circuits.

Overall impact

- 100% of Primary teachers have received coaching sessions from CSSP and through a questionnaire 100% of Teachers have increased in the confidence in delivering PE
- 70% of the primary population participated in Intra-school competitions which is an increase on last year's figure of 61%.
- 20 identified pupils attended Young Leaders workshops, gaining confidence to participate in new sports and act as a leader in the school setting.
- 94% of pupils reported by teachers had an increase in readiness to learn following sensory circuits.
