The pupils have had a fantastic start to the new school year and the first term has flown by. They are all settling in and have made some super progress. It has been lovely to see all the fun they have been having, I have managed to visit each of the primary classes and spend time with the new pupils and reconnect with existing pupils. I was hoping to visit the secondary classes after the half-term break.

Unfortunately, we have seen an increase in the number of COVID cases (7 confirmed / 2 pending) in school over the last two weeks which reflects the increase we are seeing both locally and nationally.

There is one class that is closed today, due to multiple cases within the class.

I am confident the other cases are because of community transmission and are not a result of school wide outbreak.

We do anticipate that the number of cases will continue to rise locally and as a result rise in school too.

We have made the very difficult decision to cancel the Holiday Heroes planned for next week as a number of the staff involved have tested positive and are now required to isolate. Given the extreme short notice it has not been possible to arrange suitable staff cover.

Our before and after school club will also be on hold initially for the first two weeks back and then be reviewed depending on the number of cases in school.

The Business Support Team will process refunds as soon as possible.

I understand how disappointing this will be, however, we are still in a worldwide health crisis and everyone's health & safety is my number one priority.

We all have a part to play in keeping each other safe and with this in mind please continue to test next week and immediately prior to returning to school.

Please consider your choice of activities over the half-term and whilst I appreciate it is a time to enjoy spending time with family and friends and having fun, please do this as safely as possible.
