## **Update Letter**

Dear Parents & Carers,

I hope this letter finds you all safe and well.



Unfortunately, the number of Covid cases have increased this week, with six confirmed pupil cases. We have also had several staff absent this week both Covid related and sickness. Unfortunately, we had to close a class for three days this week. I would like to thank all the parents & carers, for their understanding and support, it was much appreciated. Although cases have risen, I am confident they are a result of community transmission and not a school outbreak.

## **Current Covid Measures**

- All staff and secondary age pupils to continue wearing face-coverings when arriving, leaving, and moving around the school site.
- All staff engage in twice weekly testing until the end of the autumn term in December.
- All staff who are identified as a close contact will seek a PCR and engage in daily testing for 10 days.
- All secondary age pupils to continue with twice weekly testing until the end of the autumn term in December.
- All pupils who are identified as a close contact of a confirmed case are strongly encouraged to seek a PCR.
- All visitors to the school will be required to show evidence of a negative LFD test prior to arrival onsite and wear a face-covering throughout the duration of their visit.
- Assemblies will remain virtual.
- Lunches and breaktimes to continue in class bubbles.

As many of you know there has been a new variant "Omicron" identified and cases have been confirmed in the North-West, with this mind I would encourage all of you to follow the current government health guidance, which is for those that are invited to, to have the vaccination and booster. The guidance suggests this is one way in which we can reduced further variants. Vaccinations are now available for all adults and pupils aged 12 and over.
