Update Letter



Dear Parents & Carers,

I hope my letter finds you all safe and well.

Unfortunately, our Covid 19 cases have continued to rise, however they are relatively low in number, and we have been able to keep all classes open.

From today the guidance to special school changes, at the time of writing this letter we are still awaiting the guidance to come through. However, communication from the DFE indicates that regular testing is now no longer required. It indicates that the guidance will be as follows:

- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days


Once I have received a copy of the guidance, I will share this with you on our return to school.
