I am delighted to announce that the new school library will be open from Monday 7<sup>th</sup> November every lunchtime. We have appointed some fantastic librarians from year 5 who have been receiving training from Mr Hasnat in their important new roles.

As you may recall children from year 1 to 6 received a letter detailing the expectations of using the school library and parents/carers were asked to sign consent for their child to borrow a book and look after it.

Some of the important book care rules are:

- · Children may check out one library book at a time
- Children must return their currently checked out book before they check out a new library book
- Children must not write or draw in the library book, tear pages or remove labels or barcodes
- · Children are responsible for any damage or loss, regardless of who caused it
- Parents/Carers are responsible for paying or replacement cost linked with the library book checked out by the child


Please help us by protecting and returning the books on time. You can also help by providing a safe place at home for the book and a safe way to carry the book between home and school in a school book bag.

I have to say that the librarians have been very well trained to look out for the book care rules!

Children from year 1 to year 6 will have access to the library during their lunchtimes and there is a set rota for the different year groups. This is:

Mondays – Year 5 and Year 3 Tuesdays – Year 4 and 2 Wednesday – Year 1 Thursday – Year 6

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Your child will need to bring their school book bag into school on the day of their library session, unfortunately if they do not bring their book bag they will be unable to take a library book that particular week. So that each year group have a quality session in the library we cannot swop sessions around if your child forgets their book bag.

There has been a huge investment in purchasing a great number of new books that the children will be able to bring home on a regular basis. You can help by taking an interest in the book they bring home and listen to them read.

I look forward to seeing the children using the library at lunchtimes and wish you all many hours of happy reading.
