English

Reading

Books we are reading:

During reading we cover the following skills:

Writing

How you can help your child at home:

- Read a range of books including non-fiction and newspapers, discussing the articles.
- Talk to your child about what homework they have been given including spellings

Mathematics

During this term, we will be studying the following areas of the maths curriculum:

- Place Value
- Addition/Subtraction
- Multiplication/Division
- Fractions simplifying, ordering, adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing
- Decimals equivalence between fractions/decimals and percentages.
- Percentages finding amounts of quantities and amounts

How you can help your child at home

- Ensure you help your child with practicing their times tables up to 12 x

- Talk to your child about what homework they have been given and to explain what they are doing and why
- Squared and cubed numbers
- Correct formation of numbers when writing them

Science

During this term we are looking at Living Things and Their Habitats including:

- Carl Linnaeus's taxonomy and classification
- Branching Keys to classify plants and animals
- Animal characteristics and how they have adapted to their environment

- Investigation growing bacteria

How you can help your child at home

- Set up an investigation at home to see what conditions mould grows best in on a piece of bread, e.g. in a dark environment, a cold place, a warm place. Discuss what happens over the days.

How you can help your child at home.

- Practice observational drawings, e.g. a bowl of fruit
- Practice drawing trees/plants in the garden, shading them
- Practice drawing scenes which show perspective (closer = larger, further away = smaller)
