This half term, our History Project is going to be about the Kings and Queens in Britain's history, from William the Conqueror through to Queen Elizabeth the Second. We will be learning about the significant events during these times and how the monarchy has changed over the years.

In Science, we will be continuing our learning about plants and growth. We will be learning about the conditions a plant needs for healthy growth and watching the seeds we have already planted, grow.

In Science, children will be learning about the lifecycle of flowering plants. They will learn what different parts of the seeds are called and what plants need to help them grow strong and healthy.
