

## What does Personal, Social Health Education (PSHE) look like at Badsley Primary?

#### Intent

Here at Badsley Primary School the aim of PSHE is to acquire knowledge and understanding of cultural diversity, individuality, races and religions both within our local school and also at a national and global scale. It is our aim to promote the awareness, acceptance and celebration of a wide variety of beliefs, cultures and backgrounds.

We aim to develop the children's ability to make reasoned and informed judgements about all aspects of personal, social and emotional health. PSHE is taught throughout the school in such a way as to reflect the overall aims, value and philosophy of the school.

At Badsley Primary School PSHE plays an important role along with all other curriculum areas, particularly Rights Respecting Schools, RE and promoting SMSC.

A key priority of the PSHE curriculum at Badsley Primary is to ensure safe and secure relationships are created with all children, colleagues, parents and the wider community as part of the fulfilment of the PSHE teaching and learning. We aim to provide a safe space for children to discuss current local, national and global affairs that represent the children of our school community.

### **Implementation**

At Badsley Primary School we follow the Rotherham PSHE curriculum agreed scheme of work. The scheme is progressive and PSHE themes are taught in a cyclical manner throughout school. Therefore children have the opportunity to learn about themes in depth at an age appropriate level; subsequently preparing them for life in modern Britain.

The PSHE curriculum is also taught through the implementation of the Rights Respecting Schools Award. Sessions are taught both discreetly and through a cross-curricular approach. At Badsley Primary School we use a multi-media approach to assessment of PSHE. This includes photographic, written and teacher judgement

At Badsley Primary School we aim to provide a PSHE curriculum that is adaptable to the needs of our children and families and their current circumstances. We take note of local, national and global issues and ensure that they are addressed in a sensitive manner through our curriculum.
