**16th May - HSBC Money Awareness Day - Year 5 and Year 6 -** Pupils will take part in a money workshop day in school delivered by HSBC Staff.




**17th May - HSBC Money Awareness Day - Year 3 and Year 4 -** Pupils will take part in a money workshop day in school delivered by HSBC Staff.
