### **Eco Club**

The children that have attended eco club this term have been very busy helping the wildlife in our community. We have made some home-made bird feeders, which we have donated to some of our local care homes. If you would like to have a go at making your own bird feeder at home, we have included the instructions below.

## Pine Cone Bird Feeder

### You will need:

Pine cone

Lard

Birdseed

String Scissors



#### Instructions

- Find a pine cone from your outdoor area. Prepare a bowl with a teaspoon of lard and smother your pine cone with it. This will be messy!
- Put your pine cone in the fridge to let the lard get nice and sticky. While you're waiting, put some of your birdseed onto a plate. After 30 minutes, remove your pine cone from the fridge and roll it in the birdseed to cover it.
- Cut a piece of string about 8 inches long. Ask an adult to help. Tie the string around your cone and hang it on a tree or bush outside. Now watch for the birds!
