- Year 2 had a fantastic trip to St Annes Pier and beach on Wednesday. The children enjoyed a warm, but blustery day where they practised Art, English and Science skills in the real world. They also enjoyed some time playing on the sand!
- Year 5 enjoyed their trip to Liverpool Museum yesterday. They thoroughly enjoyed visiting each floor and learning about artefacts, but they especially enjoyed watching a short film about space in the Planetarium.
- Other exciting opportunities that have begun this week are the Year 4 Fit to Go programme and the Year 6 Unstoppable programme. The children thoroughly enjoyed their first week on these activities.

School teaches the times tables from Key Stage 1, however regular practice must also be done at home to ensure that the knowledge sticks. Year 4 parents and carers, please encourage your child to practise this weekend.
- Year 1 will also be taking their **Phonics Screening Test** next week. The children and their teachers have all been working very hard on this important part of their education. We wish Year 4 and Year 1 pupils 'Good Luck' for next week.
- **2SB** will have their **Unique Experience Day** on **Monday 10th June** they will be learning Den building skills outdoors.

 As the end of the school year fast approaches, it is time to request for any good quality school uniform, PE kit, school shoes, pumps or coats, that could be washed and donated to school to be used by another child. Donations can be brought into the school office w/c 22nd July.

Reminders:

• Safety and Wellbeing

As the weather is warming up, please remember to apply sun cream to your child's skin and send them to school and nursery wearing a sunhat each day, even on cloudier days. UV rays from the sun can still cause sun damage through clouds.

• School Appearance Code

School uniform is not optional. All children must wear the correct uniform to school. Trainers are not allowed to be worn. Any children wearing trainers will be asked to wear their P.E. pumps for the day.

• Extreme hairstyles are increasing in school despite our Uniform Code, which is published on our website. Boys' hair must look smart for school. A headband can be worn if necessary, however long hair on top and shaved sides is classed as an extreme haircut and is not allowed for school. This policy supports preparation for high school.

• Attendance and Punctuality

The government sets the standards for school attendance for every school in the UK; they expect children to attend school every day that the school is open, unless they are too ill to attend, or parents/carers have asked in advance and been given permission for their child to be off on a specific day, due to exceptional circumstances.

School doors open at 8:45 a.m. and school starts promptly at 8.55 a.m. Children who arrive after this time do not receive a school breakfast and they miss the first task of the day, missing essential learning.

Please ensure that the children are punctual for the start of the school day and that if they are not well enough to attend school, that the school office is informed before 9.30 a.m.
