

Curriculum Information Year 6

Dear Parents / Carers.

This term will be particularly busy as we start the term by completing our topics from the Autumn term, and begin our new topics for the Spring term.

During this term, we will also continue to support your child on the lead up to their SATs tests, which they will be sitting in May.

Our subjects and their topics for this term are:

<u>Maths</u> – converting units; ratio; decimals; fractions, decimals and percentages; area, perimeter and volume.

English - Writing outcomes: a narrative extract, a Persuasive Letter, a report.

Science - Electricity and Light.

R.E. – What is the nature and character of God? Our Non-Christian Faith Unit: Have you discovered any beliefs about God in common across different faiths? And Easter: Who was/is Jesus?

Geography - Fair Trade and The USA

PSHCE - Living in the Wider World.

P.E. - Our designated PE days this term are Tuesday and Friday. Please ensure that PE kit is in school, spacers are removed and long hair is fully tied back on these day.

PE Kit should consist of: a yellow t-shirt (different to the one they are wearing that day) and blue or black shorts or tracksuit bottoms/leggings. Depending on weather we may be indoor or outdoor, pupils need to have suitable footwear in school – pumps/bare feet for indoor and trainers for outdoor.

PE is part of the National Curriculum and all children are expected to take part. If your child is unable to participate please send a note in to your child's class teacher.

This term, your child will be experiencing Dance, striking and fielding (cricket) and invasion games (rugby)

SAT

This term, we will be preparing for the end of Key Stage 2 SATs tests. In order for us to support your child, during February, your child will be sitting another Mock SATs week where they will practice sitting for their English and Maths tests.

2025 SATs dates to remember:

Homework

Maths homework will mainly be completed on PowerMaths and will focus on what has been learnt in the week. This will be set on a Thursday, and should be completed by the following Tuesday.

For English, your child is expected to read to an adult at least three times a week. They should also practice their weekly spellings for the Spelling Test, which will take place on a Friday. Spelling lists will be given out every half term, as well as being uploaded onto the Google Classroom.

To prepare for the SATs tests, Year 6 children will also be set independent learning tasks on the LBQ platform, allowing the children to practise the skills required for Maths and English.

Reading

In addition to any homework tasks, you should also support your child by listening to them read every night. Once your child completes their school reading book, they are expected to complete an online quiz (in school), which asses their understanding of what they have read.

Spellings and Timestables

It is important that your child practises their spellings and timestables.

Spellings should be practised at home ready for the weekly spelling test, which will remain on a Friday. Spelling lists will be given out every term, as well as being uploaded onto the Google Classroom.

TT Rockstars is one of the platforms that we provide for the practicing of timestables.

School Uniform

It is important that your child wears correct and clean school uniform every day; this includes sensible black school shoes and their 'Always' badge.
