School Policies

We have lots of policies which help staff, parents and visitors to understand how our school is run. All of our policies are kept in the office. If you are interested in reading some of them in more detail, please ask the Headteacher.

These are brief details of the policies we felt you would be most interested in.

A Church School

We are a church school – but what does this mean? It means there is a Christian touch to all we do in school. We worship together daily, we work closely with St. Paul's Church, Marton and we seek to run our school on the principles of love and forgiveness.

When your child is in Year 5 or 6 they, and you, will be able to make a decision together about whether they should be confirmed. If together you choose for your child to make this commitment, they and you will be able to attend sessions to help them prepare for this important step in their life.

Parents have the right to withdraw their child from Religious Education and Worship, however if you choose this school for your child we cannot exclude them from the Christian care and teaching that is evident in all areas of school life.

Sex and Relationships Education

After consulting parents, we drew up a detailed policy for Sex and Relationships Education. We help children grow in their understanding of keeping their bodies safe and developing good relationships. Parents will be fully informed of what is being

We teach children how to be safe on the roads, working with parents, the police and road safety teams at different times. We also try to encourage a healthy lifestyle through "Walk to School" weeks and other events.



Race Relations

Charging

From time to time children are taken on educational visits, linked into the curriculum we are studying in school. Parents are informed of the visit details by letter and are invited to make a contribution to help meet the costs of the visit. No charge is made for cookery or DT items used as part of the curriculum, or for extra curricular
