## Pupil Premium Future Plans for 2016-17



Pupil Premium is additional money given to schools to support certain groups of children:

- Looked After Children
- Children who have been eligible for Free School Meals at any point in the last 6 years.

In 2015-16 Baines' we received £197.600 in Pupil Premium funding. It is likely to be a similar amount in 2016-17, so what are we intending to spend this money on?

- Additional Speech and Language Therapy for identified children.
- Educational Psychologist and Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator time.
- Additional Pupil Welfare support to manage attendance and punctuality.
- Additional teacher supporting phonics in Y1 and English and maths in Y2.
- Additional teacher supporting English and maths in Y3 and Y4.
- Family support worker time, using our experience Children's Centre staff.
- A structured intervention programme led by teachers/TAs across the school.
- Achievement for All a programme designed to support vulnerable pupils.
- One to one tuition for identified children.
- Increased behaviour support across the school.
- Music tuition for identified children.
- Extra curricular activities for eligible children.
- Subsidised school trips and residential visit.
- Additional resources to support English, maths and the more able.
- Additional books to broaden the available range in the library.

On 1/9/16 143 children were eligible for Pupil Premium (29.98% of the school population) and 8 children are LAC (1.67% of the school population).

On 1/1/17 144 children were eligible for Pupil Premium (29.94% of the school population) and 8 children are LAC (1.66% of the school population).
