

Spotlight this week on World Mental Health Day and Black History Day

Reception: We created artwork to represent happiness for Mental Health Day and discussed what makes us happy. We are creating artwork in the style of Stanley Whitney. We have also read about Marcus Radford and how he supported charities that provide food for families who may need extra support.

Year 1: We have explored the feeling of sadness and looked at ways we can help others if they are feeling sad, whilst understanding it is a temporary feeling. We have made our own finger painting pictures linked to the style of Alma Woodsey Thomas for Black History Awareness Day.

Year 2: We have created artwork using "energetic" patterns for Mental Health Day. We have created poetry about Floella Benjamin and artwork inspired by Bisa Butler for Black History Day.

Year 3: We have created artwork to represent "anger" for Mental Health Day. For Black History Awareness Day we created artwork inspired by Nina Chanel Abney. We also researched Walter Tull and created some fact files about him, focusing on his significant achievements.

Year 4: We have created artwork to represent "tiredness" for Mental Health Day. For Black History, we have researched Nina Simone and are creating artwork inspired by Lois Mailou Jones.

Year 5: We created a piece of artwork expressing what confusion meant to them for Mental Health Day. We have looked at the poet Benjamin Zephaniah and replicated the artwork of Kehinde Wiley.

Year 6: We have created a fact file about Stormzy and artwork inspired by Jean Michel Basquait for Black History and have created artwork to represent anxiety for mental health day.

We have had such a great week in school. Many thanks to Mrs Horne for organsing all the Black History Awareness Day work and to our fabulous Mental Health Team for all the work and activities for World Mental Health Day. The children looked great in their flash of yellow on Wednesday - thank you for your support.



Well done to the girls' football team for making it through to the finals next week. They came 2nd out of 9 teams in their pool. Congratulations and good luck next week!



























