Homework

Year 5 children should be reading for at least 15 minutes each night (but at least three times), learning their weekly spellings and completing one piece of maths and reading homework per week. Spellings will be sent home on a Monday, to be quizzed the following Monday and reading will be checked daily on BoomReader. Maths homework will be one to two pages per week based on our current or upcoming learning. Reading homework will be a comprehension based task from Literacy shed, this also counts as one of three pieces of reading children are expected to complete per week. This will be sent home on a Friday for the following Friday.

Children are expected to change their own books and record it on the BoomReader app. They will be given the opportunity to do this daily. They also need to record their new book with the Teaching Assistant to ensure they read a variety of books within the stage they are on. Children who read and have recorded this on BoomReader at least 3x a week will be entered into our class reading raffle. At the end of each half term at least 4 names will be picked from the raffle and these children will be able to choose 3 friends to take part in one of the following prizes;

1/2 hour MUGA time

1/2 hour IPad time

Picnic lunch in the classroom.

Occasionally, children will be asked to do some research in preparation for a lesson. If you know that you will struggle to do this at home, please let me know.
