

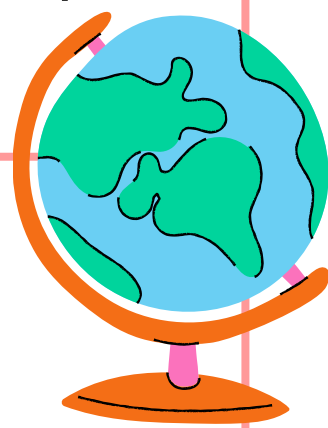
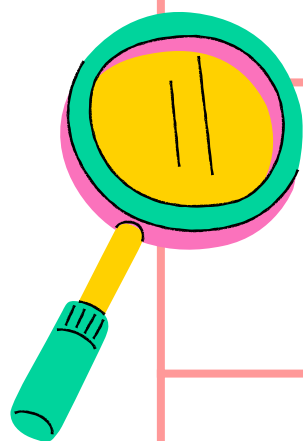

Children will receive class dojo points for positive behaviour.

Homework is used to support your child's learning alongside the skills taught in school.

We expect your child to read for 15 minutes three times a week, complete times table practice and learn their spellings. Times tables and spellings will be sent home on Thursday, to be quizzed the following Thursday

All children will be expected to know their 2,3,4,5,8 and 10 times tables, both multiplication and division facts with a fast recall by the end of this year. Please allow your child time on TT rockstars and/or practice time as much as possible. Children should be practicing 3 to 4 times a week.

Daily reading practice is vital. In school, we will be reading 1:1, in pairs, in small groups and as a whole class. Daily home reading plays a huge part in success. As you read with your child, please ask questions about what they are reading.

At times children will be required to complete a book review before changing their school reading books. This will allow the children to show their understanding and help increase their confidence. A book review may be sent home to complete as part of their reading homework.

Children who read 3 times a week, will be entered into our class reading raffle.
