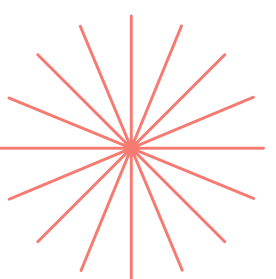
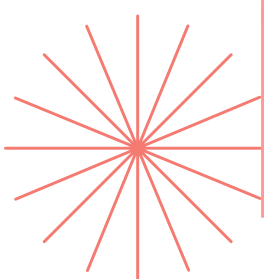
Newsletter Summer 2026

ONGOING SUPPORT: Homework is used to support your child's learning alongside the skills taught in school.

We expect your child to read for 15 minutes three times a week, complete times table practice and learn their spellings. Times tables and spellings will be sent home on Friday, to be quizzed the following Friday.

All children will be expected to know their 2,3,4,5,8 and 10 times tables, both multiplication and division facts with a fast recall by the end of this term. Please continue to allow your child time on tt rockstars and or practice time as much as possible. Really children should be practicing 3 to 4 times a week.

Occasionally, children will be asked to do some research in preparation for a lesson. If you know that you will struggle to do this at home, please let me know via class DOJO.

Daily reading practice is vital. In school, we will be reading 1:1, in pairs, in small groups and as a whole class. Much of your child's future learning success will depend on their ability to read at speed with understanding. Daily home reading plays a huge part in this success. As you read with your child, please ask questions about what they are reading.

At times children will be required to complete a book review before changing their school reading books. This will allow the children to show their understanding and help increase their confidence. A book review may be sent home to complete as part of their reading homework. Children who read 3 times a week, will be entered into our class reading raffle.
