You are able to look the presentation delivered to parents last night; Top Tips sheet for each year group; Knowledge Organiser so you know the specific content for each year group and the vocabulary the children will be taught.

For the rest of this half term each year group will be working through the Safety and Changing Body unit which includes for some year groups specific learning about RSE along with others aspects such as first aid and keeping safe online.

Moving forward, when this unit is taught, the teachers will let parents know via the Curriculum letter sent out at the beginning each term. Teachers will let you know it is the Safety and Changing Body unit and remind you about the content. This will help families to be able to support their child at home. “Are there any catch up sessions for missed content off the old approach? – the teachers are all aware that children may have missed previous content as we have changed schemes. The Kapow units all recap previous knowledge at the start so we can make sure we recap / teach missed knowledge before building on with new learning.”

“No, I believe the information provided was sufficient.”

“More information on what is taught for reception.” – we concentrated on year 1 to year 6 as reception don’t cover the same units. Their units all concentrate on managing self, self-regulation and building relationships linked to the Early Years Framework. The RSE section just starts when National Curriculum is taught from year 1.
