


BALSHAW LANE NEWSLETTER

Reception: In history reception have been looking at homes from the past and comparing them to our homes. In geography we have been looking at maps and looking at our way around by drawing our own maps.

Year 5: In geography we have begun our European contrast study by comparing Greater Manchester and Paris by locating countries around the world using digimaps and atlases.


Year 6: In geography we have been learning about North America – specifically capital cities and how they are all different.




