Homework and Reading

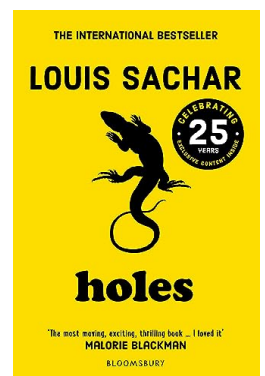
