

JIMMY ARMFIELD OBE

After the 1962 World Cup in Chile, Jimmy Armfield was voted by the Press corps as the 'best right-back in the world'. It was a supreme honour and one which he thoroughly deserved. Born in Denton, Manchester in September 1935, his family moved to Blackpool where he spent his school years and quickly began to shine at sports, notably Rugby Union and football. It was during a practice match at Bloomfield Road that manager Joe Smith spotted Armfield and offered him a trial. On 27 December 1954 he made his debut at Portsmouth to begin a 17-year association with the club, during which he made a record 569 appearances, which included ten years as captain. If any player could be described as a 'one-club-man' then Jimmy Armfield must be that one. His main attributes were speed, superb distribution, outstanding tackling and an enormous capacity for hard work. Time and time again, especially during the team's difficult days in the 1960s, he would somehow find an extra ounce of energy when all seemed lost, and in turn motivate the men around him. This was one of the many things that made him such a great captain, not only for Blackpool but also England. He developed the overlap, so loved by defenders nowadays, to such an art form, that fans used to flock to the grounds to see him in action. He struck a partnership with Stanley Matthews in the late 1950s which would time and again mesmerise opposing markers. Armfield was voted Young Player of the Year 1959 and was unlucky not to become Footballer of the Year in 1966, being narrowly beaten by Bobby Charlton. He lifted the Blackpool Player of the Year title instead, a tribute to his marvellous loyalty and leadership. Unfortunately he shared in little success whilst with the club, exception being promotion in 1969-1970. After the game at Preston he was carried off the field by jubilant supporters, with a smile on his face and pride in his heart. He, more than anyone, had helped Blackpool back to Division One. His international career began in 1956, when he appeared for the Under-23 side, and he made his full England debut on 13 May 1959 against Brazil in front of over 120,000 fans. There then followed 43 caps, a record for the club, which included 15 games as captain. As well as the 'best right-back in the world' honour, he was also voted as 'best right-back in Europe' for three successive seasons from 1962 to 1964. He bowed out of international football in 1966 to be replaced by George Cohen of Fulham, and so missed an opportunity to appear in a World Cup Final. He played his last game for Blackpool in May 1971, and was rewarded with a testimonial on his 35th birthday. Thousands turned out to pay tribute to him. He later managed Leeds United with some success and is now a football radio commentator and journalist.

THE JOHN STANNING EXHIBITION

John Stanning was the Chairman of the Governors of Balshaw's School and owner of John Stanning & Son Limited, a bleach works in Leyland. After his death in 1904, his friends collected a fund of monies, The John Stanning Memorial Trust, to be used to provide exhibitions to former pupils of Balshaw's School, now Balshaw's CE High School.

The capital value of the Trust has now been substantially restored and the Trustees recommenced the award of exhibitions in 1990. Awards will be made to former pupils of Balshaw's CE High School, who subsequently attend university, on the basis of academic excellence. An annual exhibition or exhibitions of up to £500 will be awarded to successful candidates to assist with the purchase of books or other educational requirements. Any former pupil of Balshaw's CE High School may apply.

Applications for an exhibition should be made by 30 September in each year, and wherever possible before the first term of their university studies. Applications should be made in full, in writing, to the Headteacher of Balshaw's C.E. High School.

THE LORD ROBENS PRIZE

The Robens Prize was first awarded in 1966 to May Griffiths (nee Butler), now a member of staff, following the visit of Lord Robens, then Chairman of the National Coal Board, to open the new boiler house at the Leyland and Birmingham Rubber Company. Lord Robens presented the prize on two occasions, in 1966, and January 1982 when he and Lady Robens attended Speech Night. The prize is awarded for outstanding merit in some worthy achievement, and due to the generosity of the Leyland and Birmingham Rubber Company has been awarded every year since 1966. Sadly Lord Robens died in June 1999. Unfortunately the Leyland and Birmingham Rubber Company ceased business in 2002 and has donated 2 cups for the annual presentation of the Lord Robens and Leyland and Birmingham prizes. The recipients' names will continue to be added to the existing boards. From 2003 the above will be under the jurisdiction of the Balshaw's Educational Foundation.
