


## March Newsletter

### Ofsted Report:

We were inspected by Ofsted before the half term and our report has now been published and will be available on the Ofsted website from the 21st March. However, I attach it here for you all to be able to read.

It was really good to know that our students enjoy their school, are safe, happy and proud of Balshaw's, their learning and the opportunities which they get. Some highlights from the report are below:

- Students are proud to attend their school
- Leaders are ambitious for all pupils, including those with special educational needs
- Teachers have high standards for students' academic achievement and their behaviour
- The atmosphere around school is calm and respectful
- Pupils benefit from the opportunities for their wider development
- A strong sense of school community
- Leaders and governors share a clear vision for the quality of education
- Subject leaders have thoughtfully considered the essential knowledge that they want pupils to gain
- Teachers use their expert knowledge to teach the curriculum effectively
- Staff are well trained to identify and address the needs of pupils with SEND
- Pupils with SEND have access to the same ambitious curriculum as their peers. They achieve well
- Leaders prioritise reading
- A range of programmes helps pupils to develop fluency and a love of reading
- The school library is a hub of activity
- Pupils behave well around the school and in lessons
- Following the pandemic, leaders have secured ongoing improvements to pupils' rates of
- attendance. (The school is in the top 10% of all schools for its levels of attendance)
- Leaders have devised a high-quality programme to support pupils' wider development
- Leaders actively and effectively seek ways to engage with their local community
