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What is VE day?

- Friday 8th May marks 75 years since Nazi Germany's formal surrender at the end of the Second World War.
- > VE stands for Victory in Europe.
- ➤On VE day in 1945, people took to the streets to celebrate peace after years of devastating destruction during the war.
- ➤ VE day is a time when people can remember and be thankful for the service and sacrifice of the Second World War generation.

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What is happening on VE day?

There are a number of ways in which VE day is being marked, below are a few of them.

- At 11am there will be a two minute silence to remember those who fought and lost their lives during World War Two.
- At 3pm on Friday 8th May, join in with a nationwide toast to the heroes.
 Raise a cup of tea, squash or drink to our nation's heroes who fought for our freedom during World War Two.
- At 6.55pm, there is a cry for peace. Due to CVD-19, the town criers may not be able to carry this out, however you can see the words for this on slide 11.
- At 9pm, there will be a broadcast from the Queen and also a nationwide singalong to Dame Vera Lynn's 'We'll meet again'.
- Throughout the day, there will be programmes on TV about VE day.


VE Day Prayer

Amen.




Bible readings

Micah 4:1-4

Peace and Security through Obedience

In days to come the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised up above the hills. Peoples shall stream to it, and many nations shall come and say: 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.' For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. ³ He shall judge between many peoples, and shall arbitrate between strong nations far away; they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more; but they shall all sit under their own vines and under their own fig trees, and no one shall make them afraid; for the mouth of the LORD of hosts has spoke



2 Corinthians 5:16-21

¹⁶ From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; [a] even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, be know him no longer in that way. ¹⁷ So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! ¹⁸ All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; 19 that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, [c] not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. ²⁰ So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹ For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

Unfortunately, due to the current situation, certain events and celebrations are not able to take place as planned. However it is important that in times of difficulty we unite together, so you can join in with some of the activities below to mark VE day.

Prue Leith's Muscovado Flapjacks This would not have been a common treat in WW2 since sugar and butter were severely rationed. But I thought, with lockdown making flour disappear from our grocery shelves, which it certainly did in the war too, and oats, then as now, being available, and most of us trying to cook with store cupboard ingredients, Flapjacks would fit the bill.





75 g muscovado sugar



150 g butter

275g porridge oats





1 heaped teaspoon ground cinnamon

½ teaspoon table salt



Slowly melt the sugar and butter together in a medium sized saucepan. When liquid, stir in the oats, cinnamon and salt and spoon into the baking pan. Press down flat with the

back of spoon and score through the mix to make twelve flapjacks.



Line a small roasting pan or deep baking tray with a piece of non-stick baking sheet (I use oven-liner, which is strong and re-usable).




