Arrangements for March Re-opening of Balshaw's



Test and Go - Friday 5th March

- Prior to returning to school, all schools will undertake Lateral Flow Tests of all students to check for cases of Covid that may be asymptomatic.
- This is not a day in school, instead you will use our *Test and Go* facility during the time slot you have been allocated below.
- Students are expected to wear their school uniform when they come for their test.
- There will be no live teaching for Year 11 on Friday 5th March. This is a learning consolidation day.
- Parents may drive onto the site, but must remain in their car. Please use the one-way queueing system, coming in via the side drives and leaving via the central drive.
- If students walk to school, they must not do so in a group or wait anywhere, but travel directly to school.
- Students are to walk around the outside of the school using the entrance to the right of the school building and make their way towards the fire doors of the Gym at the back of school where they will wait to be guided into the Test and Go centre.
- Once they have been tested, they will exit the Gym and go back to their car/walk directly home.
- Results will be communicated later that day.

Stage 2

Return to School - Monday 8th March 8.40am

• You will attend school following the same routines you used during the Autumn Term, arriving in uniform with mask, hand sanitiser and full uniform at Gate A at 8.40 and no later than 8.45am.

Additional Information

• Keyworker and Vulnerable Provision

The provision for keyworker and vulnerable students will continue on Friday as usual. Keyworker and Vulnerable students are already tested on a regular basis in school.

Further tests

Students will be provided with two further Lateral Flow tests in school during the following days.

Home test kits

After this point each student will be issued with two Lateral Flow Test Kits per week (providing they have given consent and undertaken the previous three tests in school).

Learning during the first week

Learning during the first week back will check knowledge and understanding of the work set during the most recent lockdown.

Exams and Assessments

The results of the consultation about examinations are due to be published on Thursday 25th February. As soon as it becomes clear what form assessment for your child's GCSEs will take, we will communicate with you again.

- What if my child or someone in my house tests positive for Covid?
 Isolation period of 10 days will have to be undertaken.
- What if my child is a close contact of a positive case?
 Isolation period of 10 days will have to be undertaken.

And finally

It is good news that infection rates are falling, but numbers in this area remain high and I want to reassure you all that the health and wellbeing of all our students and staff are at the heart of each decision we take. This is an anxious time for everyone (not least our Year 11 who still await news of how they will be assessed for their GCSEs).
